A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Baltimore County - Alcoholic Beverages - Sunday Sales

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore County to grant a Sunday permit to a holder of a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license for 4 5 an additional permit fee to be established by the Board; establishing that the permit 6 authorizes the holder to sell alcoholic beverages for off-premises consumption on 7 Sunday during certain hours; submitting this Act to a referendum of the qualified 8 voters of Baltimore County; requiring the Board to conduct a certain economic 9 impact study within a certain time period and, under certain circumstances, to work with certain license holders in developing a fee for the Sunday permit and mitigating 10 11 a certain impact; providing for a delayed effective date for certain provisions of this 12 Act; and generally relating to sales of alcoholic beverages on Sundays in Baltimore

County.

- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 25 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Alcoholic Beverages

2	This title applies only in Baltimore County.

4	(a) There is a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license.
5 6	(b) (1) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at retail at the place described in the license.
7 8	(2) The license holder shall deliver the beer, wine, or liquor in a sealed container that may not be opened or its contents consumed on the licensed premises.
9	(c) A license may not be issued for any drugstore unless the applicant:
10	(1) has been doing business at the location applied for in the license for at least 1 year before the date of the application for the license;
12 13	(2) is the assignee of a business established for at least 1 year before the date of the application for the license at the location applied for; or
4	(3) has been engaged in the retail drug business for at least 3 years.
5	(d) (1) The annual license fee is \$900.
16 17	(2) A SUNDAY PERMIT MAY BE GRANTED FOR AN ADDITIONAL FEE THAT THE BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH.

19 20	(a) (1) A holder of a Class A beer, wine, and liquor license may sell beer, wine, and liquor on Monday through Saturday from 6 a.m. to midnight.
21 22	[(2) From 7 a.m. to 9 p.m., the license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor on the Sunday immediately before:
23	(i) Christmas Day;
24	(ii) New Year's Day;
25	(iii) Rosh Hashanah; and
26	(iv) Yom Kippur.
27 28	(3) A license holder may sell beer, wine, and liquor on the two Sundays immediately before Passover if:

- the license holder does not sell beer, wine, and liquor on the two 1 (i) 2 Saturdays immediately before Passover; 3 (ii) the off-premises sales are conducted on those Sundays from 6 4 a.m. to midnight; and 5 the sales are limited to beer, wine, and liquor that are "kosher (iii) 6 for Passover".] 7 **(2) (I)** THE BOARD MAY GRANT A SUNDAY PERMIT TO THE 8 LICENSE HOLDER. 9 (II) THE PERMIT AUTHORIZES THE HOLDER TO SELL BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION ON SUNDAY FROM 6 A.M. TO 10 11 MIDNIGHT. 12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That before Section 1 of this Act becomes effective it shall first be submitted to a referendum of the qualified voters of 13 14 Baltimore County at the general election to be held in November of 2018. The County 15 governing body and the Baltimore County Board of Elections shall do those things 16 necessary and proper to provide for and hold the referendum required by this section. If a 17 majority of the votes cast on the question are "For the referred law" the provisions of Section 1 of this Act shall become effective on the 30th day following the official canvass of votes 18 19 for the referendum, but if a majority of the votes cast on the question are "Against the 20 referred law" the provisions of Section 1 of this Act are of no effect and null and void. 21SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, within 120 days after the 22provisions of Section 1 of this Act become effective, the Board of License Commissioners for 23Baltimore County shall: 24(1) conduct a study to ascertain whether granting Sunday permits in 25accordance with Section 1 of this Act will result in any economic impact on the existing 26holders of licenses that allow Sunday sales of alcoholic beverages in Baltimore County; and 27 if the Board determines that granting Sunday permits will result in a (2)28 demonstrable economic impact on existing license holders, work with the license holders in 29developing a fee for the Sunday permit and mitigating the impact.
- 30 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 3 of this Act shall take 31 effect October 1, 2018.
- SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions of Sections 2 and 4 of this Act and for the sole purpose of providing for the referendum required by Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall take effect July 1, 2017.
