# A BILL ENTITLED

# **Baltimore City Community College – Restructuring**

3 FOR the purpose of repealing the Board of Trustees of Baltimore City Community College; 4 establishing the Restructuring Board of Baltimore City Community College and  $\mathbf{5}$ transferring the powers and duties of the Board of Trustees to the Restructuring 6 Board; providing for the composition and duties of the Restructuring Board; 7 requiring each member of the Restructuring Board to serve for the duration of the 8 Restructuring Board; altering a certain authority of the Maryland Higher Education 9 Commission; requiring the Restructuring Board to elect one of its members as its 10chair, select a certain president and develop a certain strategic plan on or before a 11 certain date, review and focus certain offerings on certain needs, make workforce 12development and job placement a certain priority, improve student pathways to 13 success, enter into certain memoranda of understanding, align a certain budget with 14certain projections, engage in a certain review of positions and staff, establish certain 15relationships with certain stakeholders, rebuild and market a certain brand, address 16certain information technology needs, develop or sell certain real estate holdings, 17identify certain barriers that impede the efficient and effective operation of the 18 College, recommend a certain structure and composition of a newly constructed 19Board of Trustees, and ensure a certain transition; requiring the President of the 20College to meet certain criteria; prohibiting the President of the College from being 21a member of the Restructuring Board or a member of the Board of Trustees as it 22existed on a certain date; requiring the Restructuring Board to submit a certain 23report to the Governor and the General Assembly, on or before a certain date, 24annually, regarding its progress in implementing its duties and responsibilities; 25altering certain definitions; making certain conforming changes; providing for the 26expiration of the terms of the members of the Board of Trustees; requiring the 27publisher of the Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with the Department 28of Legislative Services, to correct cross-references and terminology in the Code that 29are rendered incorrect by this Act; making this Act an emergency measure; providing 30 for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the restructuring of 31Baltimore City Community College.

5 (iv) The Board [of Trustees] may waive the out-of-state fee as 6 determined in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph for a student who resides in the State but 7 does not meet the in-State residency requirement for tuition purposes and has moved to 8 the State as an employee or a family member of an employee as part of the Base 9 Realignment and Closure process as announced by the United States Department of 10 Defense.

11 (v) Any student attending the College who receives a tuition waiver 12 under subparagraph (iv) of this paragraph shall be included as an in-State resident for 13 computation of State aid to the College in accordance with § 16–512 of this subtitle.

14 (3) For purposes of this subsection, the number of full-time equivalent 15 students is the quotient of the number of student credit hours produced in the fiscal year 16 divided by 30.

17 (4) A student who is not a resident of the State shall be considered a 18 resident for purposes of assessing tuition and fees to the extent that such student would be 19 eligible for in-county status under the provisions of § 16–310(a)(3) or (f) of this title.

20 (5) The Board [of Trustees] shall set tuition and fees for students who are 21 residents of counties in this State other than Baltimore City at the same rate as the tuition 22 and fees charged to students who reside in Baltimore City.

23 (h) (1) [The] IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 16–505.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE 24 Board [of Trustees] shall appoint a President of the College who shall be the Chief 25 Executive Officer of the College and the Chief of Staff for the Board [of Trustees].

Department of Budget and Management, the Board [of Trustees] shall evaluate the
performance of the faculty of the College in a form developed in cooperation with the
Commission.

(a) For each fiscal year, the President shall prepare and the Board [of Trustees]
shall review, modify, as necessary, and approve an operating budget and a capital budget
for the College.

2 (a) The College possesses all of the property, assets, immunities, defenses, 3 licenses, credits, and rights of the New Community College of Baltimore, including those 4 transferred to the Board of Trustees of the New Community College of Baltimore by the 5 City of Baltimore and the Board of Trustees of the Community College of Baltimore under 6 Chapter 220 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1990.

7 (b) (1) (i) The Board [of Trustees of the College] may, in its discretion, 8 assume such liabilities and obligations of the Community College of Baltimore as the Board 9 considers necessary or useful.

10 (ii) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (d) of this section, the 11 Board [of Trustees] may assume such liabilities or obligations only if the nature and terms 12 of the obligations or liabilities to be assumed are consistent with the laws and regulations 13 of the State.

1 (c) The State shall distribute the State appropriation under this subsection to the 2 Board [of Trustees of Baltimore City Community College] on a quarterly basis.

3 (d) (3) (i) Beginning on July 1, 2006, the City of Baltimore shall be 4 responsible for providing at least \$1,000,000 in each fiscal year to support education at the 5 College.

6 (ii) Of this amount, in each fiscal year, at least \$400,000 shall be 7 expended and administered by the College for tuition reimbursement or scholarships to 8 attend classes at the College, and the remaining balance shall be expended in a manner 9 consistent with the educational mission of the College.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the publisher of the Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the Department of Legislative Services, shall correct, with no further action required by the General Assembly, cross-references and terminology rendered incorrect by this Act or any other Act of the General Assembly of 2017 that affects provisions enacted by this Act. The publisher shall adequately describe any such correction in an editor's note following the section affected.

1 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 2 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has 3 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to 4 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is 5 enacted. It shall remain effective through June 30, 2020, and, at the end of June 30, 2020, 6 with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and 7 of no further force and effect.
