Public Utilities – Water Companies and Sewage Disposal Companies – Rate Cases and Proceedings

- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the technical staff of the Public Service Commission to 5 assist a water company or a sewage disposal company in establishing a proposed just 6 and reasonable rate; authorizing the technical staff to seek information from certain 7 companies under certain circumstances; requiring the Commission to restrict the 8 availability of certain staff-assisted rate cases based on a certain threshold; 9 requiring the Commission to adopt certain regulations; providing that a section of law that requires the institution of certain proceedings under certain circumstances 10 11 to determine if certain revenues are required to allow a company to earn a certain 12 fair rate of return applies to a water company or a sewage disposal company; and 13 generally relating to rate cases and proceedings for water companies and sewage 14 disposal companies.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 Article – Public Utilities

- 24 (a) Unless otherwise ordered by the Commission, a public service company may 25 not establish a new rate or change in rate unless the public service company:

- 1 (1) provides to the Commission notice of the new rate or change in rate at 2 least 30 days before the new rate is established or current rate is changed; and
- 3 (2) publishes the new rate or change in rate in accordance with § 4–202 of 4 this subtitle during the entire 30 day notice period in new schedules or plainly indicated 5 amendments to existing schedules.
- 6 (b) The public service company shall plainly set forth in the notice and 7 publication:
- 8 (1) the changes that it proposes to the rate schedules currently in force; 9 and
- 10 (2) the effective date of the changes.
- 11 (C) (1) THE TECHNICAL STAFF OF THE COMMISSION MAY ASSIST A
 12 WATER COMPANY OR A SEWAGE DISPOSAL COMPANY IN ESTABLISHING A PROPOSED
 13 JUST AND REASONABLE RATE.
- 14 (2) IN ASSISTING A WATER COMPANY OR A SEWAGE DISPOSAL 15 COMPANY UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, THE TECHNICAL STAFF MAY SEEK 16 INFORMATION FROM THE WATER COMPANY OR THE SEWAGE DISPOSAL COMPANY.
- 17 (3) THE COMMISSION SHALL RESTRICT THE AVAILABILITY OF
 18 STAFF-ASSISTED RATE CASES AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION TO WATER
 19 COMPANIES OR SEWAGE DISPOSAL COMPANIES WHOSE GROSS ANNUAL REVENUES,
 20 FOR THE MOST RECENT CALENDAR YEAR FOR WHICH DATA ARE AVAILABLE, ARE
 21 BELOW AN AMOUNT DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION, NOT TO EXCEED \$1,000,000.
- 22 (4) THE COMMISSION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO ESTABLISH 23 FORMAL RULES FOR STAFF-ASSISTED RATE CASES AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS 24 SUBSECTION.

- 26 (a) This section applies only to a gas company, electric company, [or] telephone company, WATER COMPANY, OR SEWAGE DISPOSAL COMPANY whose gross annual revenues, for the most recent calendar year for which data are available, are less than 3% of the total gross annual revenues of all public service companies in the State during the same calendar year.
- 31 (b) (1) When the Commission suspends a proposed new rate for a company 32 subject to this section that is based on the existing authorized fair rate of return, the 33 Commission promptly shall institute proceedings to determine if additional revenues are

1 required to allow the company to earn the existing fair rate of return authorized in the 2 previous base rate proceeding. 3 (2)The Commission shall: 4 serve each of the parties to the previous base rate proceeding of that company with a copy of the suspension order; and 5 6 (ii) order the company to publish a display advertisement about the 7 proposal in newspapers of general circulation in its service area. 8 (3)Proceedings under this section shall: 9 (i) account for revenues, expenses, and rate base in the same manner that the Commission employed in determining a just and reasonable rate in the 10 previous base rate proceeding; and 11 12 (ii) exclude consideration of any increase in the rate of return, any 13 change in rate structure, or any change in an accounting approach to any item pertaining to revenues, expenses, or rate base inconsistent with that used by the Commission in 14 determining a just and reasonable rate in the previous base rate proceeding on the 15 16 company. 17 **(4)** In proceedings under this section, the Commission may use a more 18 recent past test period than that used in the previous base rate proceeding for the company. 19 The Commission shall enter a final order as to the revenue requirement (5)20 determined under this section within 90 days after the proposed new rate is filed. 21 (6) The final order shall: 22authorize a new rate distributing any change in the revenue 23requirement proportionally among the ratepayers without change in the rate structure; 24and 25 (ii) state whether further proceedings shall be held. 26 If, in the final order, the Commission decides to conduct further 27 proceedings under subsection (c) of this section, the final order may provide for refund, consistent with the provisions of § 4-204(c) of this subtitle, of any difference between the 28 29 new rate authorized under this subsection and the rate the Commission sets under 30 subsection (c) of this section.
