2 **Police Training Commission – Training Requirements – Human Trafficking**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Police Training Commission to require that certain  
4 entrance-level and in-service police training conducted by the State and each county  
5 and municipal police training school include certain training relating to the criminal  
6 laws concerning human trafficking and the appropriate treatment of victims of  
7 human trafficking; ~~authorizing certain training to be conducted in person or online;~~  
8 and generally relating to police training requirements.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
