BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Labor and Employment Section 3-714 Annotated Code of Maryland (2016 Replacement Volume) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - Labor and Employment** 3-714. In this section, "eligible veteran" means a veteran of any branch of the armed forces of the United States who has received an honorable discharge or a certificate of satisfactory completion of military service, including:
