A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Department of Health and Mental Hygiene – Abuser Registry Workgroup Recommendations – Report

FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to report on
the status of the implementation of certain recommendations of the Abuser Registry
Workgroup; specifying certain recommendations on which the Department must
report; requiring the Department to submit a certain report to the Governor and the
General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to the Abuser
Registry Workgroup and the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

10 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 11 That:

(a) The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall provide a progress report
 on the status of the implementation of the recommendations of the Abuser Registry
 Workgroup, which was originally convened in 2012 and reconvened by Chapter 239 of 2013.

15 (b) Specifically, the Department shall report on:

16 (1) the creation of a definition of "abuse" that is universal throughout the 17 Maryland Annotated Code;

18 (2) reducing instances of abuse and neglect in health care settings through 19 efforts to educate consumers, providers, direct access employees, first responders, and 20 prosecutors about reporting obligations, raising abuse and neglect awareness, and 21 implementing and enforcing laws consistently across the State;

(3) assessing the feasibility of establishing an employee database of direct
 access employees as part of the Maryland Background Check Program or as a separate and
 parallel system; and

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1 (4) establishing the Maryland Background Check Program for use as a tool 2 to reduce abuse, neglect, and the misappropriation of funds in long-term care facilities.

3 (c) On or before September 1, 2017, the Department of Health and Mental 4 Hygiene shall report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State 5 Government Article, the General Assembly on the implementation of the recommendations 6 of the Abuser Registry Workgroup specified in subsection (b) of this section.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
 1, 2017.
