AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before December 31 2017, 2018, subject to funding made available to the Department of Natural Resources to implement Section 1 of this Act, the Department of Natural Resources shall prepare the cownose ray fishery management plan required by § 4–215(b)(25) of the Natural Resources Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act.
6	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
7 8 9	(a) In this section, "cownose ray fishing tournament contest" means any competition, tournament contest, competition, or derby with the objective of catching or killing cownose rays for:
10	(1) prizes or other inducements; or
11	(2) entertainment purposes.
12 13	(b) <u>Until July 1, 2018</u> 2019, a person may not <del>organize,</del> sponsor, <del>promote,</del> conduct or participate in a cownose ray fishing <del>tournament</del> contest in State waters.
14 15 16	(c) A person who violates subsection (b) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to the penalties provided in § 4–1201(a) and (b) of the Natural Resources Article.

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
