CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Elective Franchise – Registration and Voting at Polling Place

FOR the purpose of authorizing the General Assembly to provide by suitable enactment a
process to allow a qualified individual to register and vote at a polling place on
election day or on a day designated for voting before election day; making a stylistic
change; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State for their
adoption or rejection.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

15 (Three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses concurring), That it be

16 proposed that the Maryland Constitution read as follows:

17 Article I – Elective Franchise

All elections shall be by ballot. Except as provided in **SECTION 2A OR** Section 3 of this article, every citizen of the United States, of the age of 18 years or upwards, who is a resident of the State as of the time for the closing of registration next preceding the election, shall be entitled to vote in the ward or election district in which the citizen resides at all elections to be held in this State. A person once entitled to vote in any election district, shall be entitled to vote there until the person shall have acquired a residence in another election district or ward in this State.

10 [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SECTION 2A OF THIS ARTICLE, THE General Assembly shall provide by law for a uniform Registration of the names of all the voters in 11 12this State, who possess the qualifications prescribed in this Article, which Registration 13shall be conclusive evidence to the Judges of Election of the right of every person, thus 14registered, to vote at any election thereafter held in this State; but no person shall vote, at 15any election, Federal or State, hereafter to be held in this State, or at any municipal election 16in the City of Baltimore, unless [his] THE PERSON'S name appears in the list of registered voters; the names of all persons shall be added to the list of gualified voters by the officers 1718 of Registration, who have the qualifications prescribed in the first section of this Article. 19and who are not disgualified under the provisions of the second and third sections thereof.

20 **2A.**

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO PROVIDE BY SUITABLE ENACTMENT A PROCESS TO ALLOW A QUALIFIED INDIVIDUAL TO REGISTER AND VOTE AT A POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY OR ON A DAY DESIGNATED FOR VOTING BEFORE ELECTION DAY IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 3(B) OF THIS ARTICLE.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly 27 determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act affects 28 multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland 29 Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section 30 31proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the 32qualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November 2018 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. At that 33 34general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution shall be by 35ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the Constitutional 36 Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now provided by law. 37 Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and 38 against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution, 39 and further proceedings had in accordance with Article XIV.

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
