1 AN ACT concerning

State Board of Pharmacy – Dispensing of Drugs Containing Controlled Dangerous Substances – Requirements

- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring, except under certain circumstances, a pharmacist to dispense drugs that contain certain controlled dangerous substances in lockable $\mathbf{5}$ 6 vials; authorizing the State Board of Pharmacy to adopt certain regulations; 7 requiring the Board to create and make available to pharmacists a statement that 8 educates patients on the potential for abuse and diversion of drugs that contain 9 certain controlled dangerous substances; requiring a pharmacist to provide the 10 statement to certain patients; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the 11 dispensing of drugs containing controlled dangerous substances.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2017.
