CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors – Sunset Extension and**
3 **Program Evaluation**

4 FOR the purpose of continuing the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors in
5 accordance with the provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (sunset law)
6 by extending to a certain date the termination provisions relating to the statutory
7 and regulatory authority of the Board; requiring that an evaluation of the Board and
8 the statutes and regulations that relate to the Board be performed on or before a
9 certain date; requiring the Board to conduct a certain workload analysis and a
10 certain fiscal analysis and submit a certain report to the Department of Legislative
11 Services on or before a certain date; requiring the Board to report on or before certain
12 dates to certain committees of the General Assembly on certain Board action and
13 efforts and the comparability of a certain provision of law to certain laws and
14 regulations in other states; and generally relating to the State Board of Morticians
15 and Funeral Directors.

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
4 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 **Article – Health Occupations**

6 7–702.

7 Subject to the evaluation and reestablishment provisions of the Program Evaluation
8 Act, this title and all rules and regulations adopted under this title shall terminate and be
9 of no effect after July 1, [2018] **2028**.

10 **Article – State Government**

11 8–405.

12 (b) Each of the following governmental activities or units and the statutes and
13 regulations that relate to the governmental activities or units are subject to full evaluation,
14 in the evaluation year specified, without the need for a preliminary evaluation:

15 (2) Morticians and Funeral Directors, State Board of (§ 7–201 of the Health
16 Occupations Article: [2016] **2026**);

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before November 1,
18 2017, the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors shall report to the Senate
19 Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and
20 Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government
21 Article, regarding the comparability of § 5–513(g)(2)(i) of the Health – General Article to
22 the laws and regulations of other states. The report shall include a survey of other states,
23 if any, that conduct inspections, either announced or unannounced, of out-of-state facilities
24 to which the body of a decedent may be transported.

25 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before January 1, 2018,
26 the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors shall:

27 (1) conduct:

28 (i) a workload analysis to determine whether fees collected from
29 each group regulated by the Board adequately reflect the costs associated with regulating
30 that group; and

31 (ii) an internal fiscal analysis, including a reassessment of its fee
32 schedule; and

33 (2) submit a report to the Department of Legislative Services on:

- 1 (i) the findings of the Board’s workload analysis;
- 2 (ii) the findings of the Board’s internal fiscal analysis and
3 reassessment of its fee schedule;
- 4 (iii) any proposed changes to the Board’s fee schedule; and
- 5 (iv) the status of filling the vacant staff position and, if filled, the
6 impact of filling the position on the Board’s expenditures, the fund balance, and the number
7 of overtime hours worked by Board staff.

8 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 2019,
9 the State Board of Morticians and Funeral Directors shall report to the Senate Education,
10 Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Health and Government
11 Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, on:

- 12 (1) Board action taken in response to the findings of the workload analysis
13 and internal fiscal analysis required to be conducted by the Board under Section 3 of this
14 Act; and
- 15 (2) Board efforts to:
 - 16 (i) ensure sufficient staff resources;
 - 17 (ii) work with the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to
18 facilitate Board record keeping and improve the Board’s Web site;
 - 19 (iii) work to improve the negative perception of the Board by some
20 licensees; and
 - 21 (iv) further enhance communications with the industry.

22 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June
23 1, 2017.
