A BILL ENTITLED1 **AN ACT** concerning2 **Public Schools and Shelters – Homeless Girls and Women – Feminine Hygiene**
3 **Products**4 **FOR** the purpose of requiring each county board of education to make available to certain
5 homeless female students a certain supply of feminine hygiene products in a certain
6 manner; authorizing funds provided by the Department of Human Resources to local
7 administering agencies for certain service providers and to certain service providers
8 for a certain purpose to be used to purchase a certain supply of feminine hygiene
9 products for a certain purpose; providing that certain feminine hygiene products be
10 made available free to certain female residents in shelters; defining certain terms;
11 and generally relating to feminine hygiene products for homeless girls and women.12 **BY** adding to

23 **SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,**
24 **That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:**25 **Article – Education**

2 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS" MEANS TAMPONS
3 AND SANITARY NAPKINS FOR USE IN CONNECTION WITH THE MENSTRUAL CYCLE.

4 (B) EACH COUNTY BOARD, THROUGH SCHOOL NURSES, SHALL MAKE
5 AVAILABLE TO FEMALE STUDENTS WHO ARE DETERMINED TO BE HOMELESS
6 CHILDREN OR YOUTH UNDER THE FEDERAL MCKINNEY-VENTO HOMELESS
7 ASSISTANCE ACT A FREE SUPPLY OF FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS SUFFICIENT TO
8 MEET THE NEEDS OF THE STUDENTS.

14 (A) (1) IN THIS PART THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
15 INDICATED.

16 (2) "FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS" MEANS TAMPONS AND
17 SANITARY NAPKINS FOR USE IN CONNECTION WITH THE MENSTRUAL CYCLE.

18 (3) "LOCAL ADMINISTERING AGENCY" MEANS THE AGENCY
19 DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT OR A LOCAL GOVERNMENT TO MANAGE THE
20 PROGRAMS FOR TRANSITIONAL HOUSING SERVICES, INCLUDING THE HOMELESS
21 WOMEN – CRISIS SHELTER HOME PROGRAM, AND TO PROVIDE A SERVICE
22 DIRECTLY OR BY CONTRACT WITH A SERVICE PROVIDER.

23 (4) "SERVICE PROVIDER" MEANS A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE NONPROFIT
24 THAT CONTRACTS WITH THE DEPARTMENT OR A LOCAL ADMINISTERING AGENCY TO
25 PROVIDE SHELTER SERVICES FOR HOMELESS INDIVIDUALS.

26 (B) (1) FUNDS PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO LOCAL
27 ADMINISTERING AGENCIES FOR SERVICE PROVIDERS AND TO SERVICE PROVIDERS
28 FOR PROGRAMS FOR TRANSITIONAL HOUSING SERVICES, INCLUDING THE
29 HOMELESS WOMEN – CRISIS SHELTER HOME PROGRAM, MAY BE USED TO
30 PURCHASE A SUPPLY OF FEMININE HYGIENE PRODUCTS SUFFICIENT TO MEET THE
31 NEEDS OF FEMALE RESIDENTS IN SHELTERS.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
5 1, 2017.
