A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Correctional Officers' Retirement System – Membership

3 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System to include certain individuals serving in certain positions in the Department 4 $\mathbf{5}$ of Public Safety and Correctional Services; providing that certain members of the 6 Correctional Officers' Retirement System who meet certain criteria may receive a 7 normal service retirement allowance that is based on certain creditable service; 8 requiring the State Retirement Agency, on or before a certain date, to notify certain 9 individuals affected by this Act of their right to transfer certain service credit to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; and generally relating to membership in 10 11 the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

- 7 (2) A member is entitled to receive a normal service retirement allowance 8 that equals an allowance based on the creditable service the member has in the 9 Correctional Officers' Retirement System.
- 10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 2017, 11 the State Retirement Agency shall notify the individuals who are affected by this Act of 12 their right to transfer service credit from the Employees' Retirement System or the 13 Employees' Pension System to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July1, 2017.
