Task Force on Internet, Wireless, and Cellular Service on the Eastern Shore Connecting Rural Maryland Act of 2017

4 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force on Rural Internet, Broadband, Wireless, 5 and Cellular Service on the Eastern Shore; providing for the composition, chair, and 6 staffing of the Task Force; authorizing the chair of the Task Force to appoint 7 additional members to the Task Force as deemed necessary by the chair; prohibiting 8 a member of the Task Force from receiving certain compensation, but authorizing 9 the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the Task Force to study and make 10 recommendations regarding certain matters; requiring the Task Force to report its 11 findings and recommendations to the Governor and the General Assembly on or 12 before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating 13 to the Task Force on Rural Internet, Broadband, Wireless, and Cellular Service on the Eastern Shore. 14

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 16 That:

- 17 (a) There is a Task Force on <u>Rural Internet, Broadband</u>, Wireless, and Cellular 18 Service on the Eastern Shore.
- 19 (b) The Subject to subsection (c)(2) of this section, the Task Force consists of the 20 following members:
