A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Adult High School Pilot Program**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing an Adult High School Pilot Program; providing for the
4 purpose of the Program; providing that the Program is under the authority and
5 supervision of the State Department of Education and the Department of Labor,
6 Licensing, and Regulation; authorizing the Department, in consultation with the
7 Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, to approve up to a certain number
8 of pilots; establishing requirements for a pilot under the Program; requiring the
9 Department and the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to consider
10 certain items when considering whether to approve a certain pilot; providing that a
11 certain pilot is not a public school for certain purposes; requiring an applicant to
12 submit a certain plan to the Department and the Department of Labor, Licensing,
13 and Regulation that includes certain information; requiring the Department, in
14 consultation with the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation, to approve
15 or disapprove certain items within a certain period of time; requiring the State Board
16 of Education to grant a certain pilot a waiver from certain regulations; prohibiting
17 the State Board from granting a waiver of a certain assessment requirement in a
18 certain regulation; requiring a pilot to be subject to the requirements of a certain
19 federal law; requiring the Department and the Department of Labor, Licensing, and
20 Regulation to establish qualifications for operators of pilots under the Program;
21 providing for the minimum content of certain qualifications; requiring certain
22 operators to adopt certain written standards; requiring certain standards to be
23 submitted to the Department and Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation
24 for approval; authorizing an operator to partner with certain entities; requiring an
25 Advisory Board to govern a pilot; providing for the membership, appointments,
26 officers, and filling of vacancies for an Advisory Board; providing for the
27 qualifications of teachers and the salaries of certain teachers and certain
28 professional personnel of a pilot; authorizing the operator or the Advisory Board to
29 apply for and accept certain funding from certain entities; requiring an operator to
30 conduct a certain evaluation each year; requiring an operator, after receiving certain
31 approval from the Advisory Board, to submit a certain evaluation report to certain

departments; requiring, beginning on a certain date, a certain operator to submit certain information to certain departments; requiring the Department and the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to jointly submit to the Governor and the General Assembly a certain report on or before a certain date; requiring the Department and the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to send a certain written notice to certain pilots under certain circumstances; requiring the Department and the Department of Labor, Licensing, and Regulation to jointly adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Adult High School Pilot Program.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,

23 (B) "OPERATOR" MEANS A PRIVATE NONPROFIT ENTITY THAT

(VII) THE WRAPAROUND SERVICES OFFERED;

(VIII) A DESCRIPTION OF THE ADVISORY AND COACHING PROVIDED TO STUDENTS:

1. ESTABLISH CAREER PATHWAYS IN HIGH NEED AND SECTORS; AND

2. MAKE EFFECTIVE TRANSITIONS INTO ATION AND INDUSTRY CREDENTIALING OPPORTUNITIES;

(IX) THE PILOT'S GOVERNANCE PLAN; AND

(X) A DETAILED BUDGET FOR THE INITIAL 3-YEAR OPERATING MONSTRATES THE PILOT'S FINANCIAL SELF-SUFFICIENCY.

15 (A) (1) THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR,
16 LICENSING, AND REGULATION SHALL ESTABLISH QUALIFICATIONS FOR
17 OPERATORS OF PILOTS UNDER THE PROGRAM.

18 (2) THE QUALIFICATIONS SHALL, AT A MINIMUM, REQUIRE AN
19 OPERATOR TO:

20 (I) BE REGISTERED AS A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION IN THE
21 STATE;

22 (II) HAVE PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE AND MEASURED SUCCESS IN
23 PROVIDING EDUCATION SERVICES TO ADULT LEARNERS, INCLUDING INDUSTRY
24 CERTIFICATION AND JOB PLACEMENT SERVICES;

25 (III) HAVE PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE PROVIDING EDUCATION
26 SERVICES OR WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT SERVICES TO ADULT LEARNERS WHO
27 HAVE BEEN LIMITED BY EDUCATIONAL DISADVANTAGES, A DISABILITY, A CRIMINAL
28 RECORD, OR SIMILAR BARRIERS TO EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES; AND

29 (IV) HAVE SECURED FINANCING TO DEVELOP OR THE
30 CAPABILITY TO SECURE FINANCING FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A PHYSICAL SITE
31 FOR THE PILOT.

32 (3) AN OPERATOR MAY BE A PARTNERSHIP OF TWO OR MORE
33 PERSONS THAT MEET THE QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION.

1 **(B) (1) THE OPERATOR SHALL ADOPT WRITTEN STANDARDS FOR THE**
2 **ADMISSION AND DISMISSAL OF STUDENTS.**

3 **(2) THE STANDARDS AND ANY AMENDMENTS SHALL BE SUBMITTED**
4 **TO THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND**
5 **REGULATION FOR APPROVAL.**

6 **(C) THE OPERATOR MAY PARTNER WITH:**

7 **(1) A COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION; OR**

8 **(2) A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE IF**
9 **THE OPERATOR INTENDS TO PROVIDE COURSE WORK FOR COLLEGE CREDIT.**

11 **(A) AN ADVISORY BOARD SHALL GOVERN A PILOT.**

12 **(B) (1) AN ADVISORY BOARD SHALL CONSIST OF AT LEAST 11 MEMBERS**
13 **AND NOT MORE THAN 25 MEMBERS.**

14 **(2) OF THE ADVISORY BOARD MEMBERS:**

15 **(I) ONE SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE DEPARTMENT;**

16 **(II) ONE SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF**
17 **LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION; AND**

18 **(III) THE REMAINING MEMBERS SHALL BE SELECTED IN**
19 **ACCORDANCE WITH THE BYLAWS OF THE PILOT.**

20 **(C) A VACANCY SHALL BE FILLED IN THE SAME MANNER IN WHICH THE**
21 **VACATING MEMBER WAS APPOINTED OR SELECTED.**

22 **(D) THE ADVISORY BOARD SHALL DETERMINE ITS OFFICERS.**

24 **(A) TEACHERS OF ACADEMIC SUBJECTS IN THE SECONDARY EDUCATION**
25 **CURRICULUM SHALL BE CERTIFIED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF**
26 **THIS ARTICLE.**

1 (B) TEACHERS AND ANY OTHER PROFESSIONAL PERSONNEL AT A PILOT
2 SHALL BE PAID AN ANNUAL SALARY THAT IS AT LEAST EQUAL TO THE SALARY
3 RECEIVED BY PUBLIC SCHOOL TEACHERS AND PROFESSIONAL PERSONNEL OF
4 SIMILAR TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE IN THE COUNTY IN WHICH THE SCHOOL IS
5 LOCATED.

7 THE OPERATOR OR ADVISORY BOARD OF A PILOT MAY APPLY FOR AND
8 ACCEPT DONATIONS, GRANTS, OR OTHER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FROM A
9 GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY OR ANY NONPROFIT OR OTHER PRIVATE ORGANIZATION.

10 **9.7-109.**

11 (A) AN OPERATOR SHALL CONDUCT AN EVALUATION OF THE PILOT EACH
12 YEAR.

13 (B) THE OPERATOR, AFTER RECEIVING APPROVAL OF THE ADVISORY
14 BOARD, SHALL SUBMIT TO THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR,
15 LICENSING, AND REGULATION AN EVALUATION REPORT FOR THE PRIOR FISCAL
16 YEAR THAT INCLUDES:

17 (1) THE ACADEMIC AND CAREER PROGRESS OF EACH STUDENT
18 ENROLLED IN THE PILOT; AND

19 (2) THE PILOT'S FISCAL YEAR FINANCIAL REPORT.

21 (A) BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2018, AND ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1 EACH
22 YEAR THEREAFTER, THE OPERATOR OF A PILOT SHALL SUBMIT TO THE
23 DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION
24 THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION FOR THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR:

25 (1) WHETHER STUDENTS ENROLLED IN THE PILOT ARE ON TRACK
26 FOR COMPLETION IN A TIME DETERMINED TO BE REASONABLE BY THE ADVISORY
27 BOARD OF THE PILOT;

28 (2) THE ACADEMIC LEVELS OF THE STUDENTS AT THE TIME OF
29 ENROLLMENT IN THE PILOT;

30 (3) THE NUMBER OF:

(I) CREDITS STUDENTS COMPLETED; AND

(II) STUDENTS WHO COMPLETED AND GRADUATED FROM THE

(5) THE GRADUATION RATE;

(8) ANY REPORTED POSTGRADUATION EMPLOYMENT.

13 (B) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 2020, THE DEPARTMENT AND THE
14 DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION SHALL JOINTLY SUBMIT
15 TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE
16 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY A REPORT THAT INCLUDES:

17 (1) AN EVALUATION OF EACH PILOT APPROVED UNDER THIS
18 SUBTITLE;

23 (4) THE FISCAL SOLVENCY OF THE PROGRAM.

24 9.7-111.

25 (A) IF THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING,
26 AND REGULATION AGREE THAT THE PROGRAM IS NOT EFFECTIVE, THE
27 DEPARTMENT AND DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND REGULATION SHALL
28 SEND WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE PILOTS THAT THE PROGRAM HAS BEEN
29 DISCONTINUED.

1 **(B) THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF LABOR, LICENSING, AND**
2 **REGULATION SHALL JOINTLY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM.**

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
4 1, 2017.
