- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, in 4 consultation with the Department of the Environment and the Department of Agriculture, to study and make recommendations regarding the impact of atrazine in the State; specifying the parameters of the study; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to report the findings and recommendations to the Governor and certain committees of the General Assembly on or before a certain date in accordance with certain requirements and make the report available to the public 10 on its Web site; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to a study on the impact of atrazine on public health, the environment, and agriculture.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13 That:
- 14 The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, in consultation with the 15 Department of the Environment and the Department of Agriculture, shall study and make 16 recommendations about the impact of atrazine on public health, the environment, and agriculture. 17
