6 7	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

10	This title applies only in Washington County.

12 13	(a) There is a Class B beer, wine, and liquor [(on-sale)] hotel and restaurant license.
14	(b) The Board may issue the license to the owner of a hotel or motel that:
15 16	(1) is in a building at least three stories tall that was originally constructed for hotel or motel purposes;
17	(2) has a capital investment of at least \$500,000; and
18	(3) contains:
19	(i) at least one passenger elevator;
20	(ii) at least 100 rooms to accommodate the public;
21 22	(iii) a lobby with a registration and mail desk and seating facilities and
23	(iv) a ballroom, conference room, or banquet room.
242526	(c) The license authorizes the license holder to sell beer, wine, and liquor at a hotel or restaurant at retail at the place described in the license[, for on-premises consumption]:
27	(1) through room service or otherwise to registered guests; or

- 1 (2) by the glass, bottle, or can to individuals attending an event in a ballroom, conference room, or banquet room.
- 3 (D) THE PRIVILEGES OF THE LICENSE MAY BE EXERCISED:

- 21 (2) The fee for a Sunday permit is \$250.
- [(f)] (G) (H) The Board may adopt regulations to carry out this section, including regulations that:
- 24 (1) provide for the manner of dispensing beer, wine, and liquor under the
- 25 license;
- 26 (2) provide for the hours and days of sale; and
- 27 (3) limit the quantity of alcoholic beverages that may be sold to an 28 individual as a single serving or during a 24-hour period.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 30 1, 2017.
