BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Criminal Law Section 3-202 Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2016 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Criminal Law 3-202.A person may not intentionally cause or attempt to cause serious (a) (1) physical injury to another. (2)A person may not commit an assault with a firearm, including: a handgun, antique firearm, rifle, shotgun, short-barreled shotgun, or short–barreled rifle, as those terms are defined in § 4–201 of this article; (ii) an assault pistol, as defined in § 4–301 of this article;
