10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

St. Lukes School was created in 1979 by a group of local parents with a desire to establish a preschool in the Bay Hundred Area. Operated under the umbrella of St. Lukes United Methodist Church in St. Michaels, MD, the school is committed to providing a quality program that: facilitates each students intellectual, social and physical development encourages learning through discovery and exploration; and occurs in a child-focused, nurturing environment. The program is designed to meet individual needs of our students by maintaining a low teacher-to-child ratio of 1:6. St. Lukes is open to all children, ages two to five. St. Lukes School is the only preschool in the Bay Hundred area that offers part-time programs.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

St. Lukes School needs new playground equipment. Outdoor play provides opportunities for the children to develop their physical, social-emotional, and cognitive and language skills. Our current equipment consists of a main play structure with slides, steps, bridge and a house; a wooden platform with tunnel, a rock climbing structure and a large sandbox. The main play structure is built from wood, and is soon due for replacement in its current condition. It is approximately 20 years old.and not ADA compliant. Our extra-large sandbox is well used on a daily basis. We have already purchased mulch for the surface. Needs now include replacing the main play structure and tunnel with equipment that has a longer lifespan, requires less maintenance, and is ADA compliant. We also plan to replace the existing damaged fencing and wooden borders on the sandbox for continued long-term use.

The need for the new playground challenges the school to raise additional funds, rather than raising tuition that would then not be affordable for local families. The school has raised \$20,000 for this project through grants and private donations. The design has been completed, and a deposit placed on the playground structure. We are in the permitting phase and hope to have the project completed by the end of the summer.
