10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Inner Arbor Trust, Inc. is an independent, Maryland 501(c)(3) charitable organization, established in 2013 for the purpose to design, develop and manage Merriweather Park at Symphony Woods, the 50-acre tract of land surrounding the legendary Merriweather Post Pavilion (now owned by another charitable organization). The Inner Arbor Trust has a Perpetual Easement on the property from Columbia Association, which also granted the Trust \$1.6 Million for Park planning costs. In 2010, Howard County legislated new planning and zoning law for downtown Columbia, which describes the Park as, "...a new kind of cultural park where the landscape becomes the setting for arts, cultural and civic uses." In November of 2014, the Howard County Planning Board unanimously approved the Site Development Plan for the seven phase Park plan.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

Phase 1 of the Park, the Chrysalis, is a high performance outdoor Stage, a public park pavilion and an iconic urban scale Sculpture. The Chrysalis is to be used for concerts and performances, as a public destination, and as large scale art seen by pedestrians and commuters, alike. The Chrysalis is primarily funded by \$6.395 Million in Howard County grants, with additional support from Howard Hughes Corporation and the Trust. The requested funding will provide for additional architectural lighting and other capitalized costs. The functional art Chrysalis is designed by a world class team of artists, architects, engineers and fabricators. The already award-winning Chrysalis is destined to become a Maryland landmark. The Chrysalis has been under construction since September, 2015, by general contractor Whiting-Turner Contracting Company and specialty contractor A. Zahner Company. The Chrysalis is scheduled to open on April 22, 2017.

28. Comments

The Chrysalis will be used by cultural and civic organizations such as the Columbia Orchestra, Columbia Festival of the Arts, Howard County Arts Council, Columbia Center for Theatrical Arts, and the Downtown Columbia Partnership; and, it will also be used by Merriweather Post Pavilion (now owned by the charitable Downtown Columbia Arts and Cultural Commission), for both its well known music festivals and a new series of performances not now accommodated by the large covered Pavilion.

The Chrysalis can accommodate from up to 15,000 guests in lawn seating and standing capacity under a canopy of tall trees, and it can accommodate 400 guests in the Chrysalis itself. As a high performance stage, the Chrysalis structure can support 58,000 lbs. of theatrical lighting, sound and scenery from its domed ceiling, and the Chrysalis provides 2,000 amps of electrical service. The 4,500 sq. ft. stage is as large as the stage at Carnegie Hall, has its own 500 sq. ft. dedicated receiving dock, and has 1,500 sq. ft. of storage, green room and utility walkout basement.
