- 2 (a) In this section, "Committee" means the Maryland Sexual Assault Evidence 3 Kit Policy and Funding Committee.
- 4 (f) (1) The Attorney General, in consultation with the Committee, shall adopt 5 regulations based on the Committee's recommendations providing for the collection, 6 testing, and retention of sexual assault evidence collection kits in the State.

- 13 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 14 (c) (1) "CODIS" means the Federal Bureau of Investigation's "Combined DNA Index System" that allows the storage and exchange of DNA records submitted by federal, state, and local forensic DNA laboratories.
- 17 (2) "CODIS" includes the national DNA index administered and operated 18 by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
