A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Elections - Ballots - Random Ordering of Names

FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that the names of certain candidates for election be listed in a certain alphabetical order; requiring a local board of elections to conduct a random drawing of the names of the candidates for election to determine the order of the names on the ballot; requiring the drawing to be conducted in the manner required by the State Board of Elections; defining a certain term; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to the placement of names on the ballot of candidates for election.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 17 Article Election Law
 - 18 9–210.
 - 19 (j) (1) In a primary election:

20 (i) on a voting machine ballot, the names of the candidates for party
 21 nomination shall be grouped together by party; and

(ii) on a document ballot, the ballot shall include only the names of
 candidates for which the voter is entitled to vote.

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(2)In a general election: $\mathbf{2}$ (i) on a voting machine ballot, the names of the candidates of a 3 political party shall be grouped together in adjacent rows or columns, and the majority party candidates shall be placed in the first row or column, followed by the candidates of 4 the principal minority party, followed by other political parties in descending order based $\mathbf{5}$ on the number of voters registered with the party, and finally by candidates not nominees 6 7of a political party; and

8 on a document ballot, for each office the names of candidates (ii) 9 shall be grouped together by party, with the majority party candidate or candidates listed 10 first, followed by the candidate or candidates of the principal minority party, followed by 11 the candidate or candidates of other political parties in descending order based on the 12statewide registration of the party, and finally by candidates who are not nominees of a 13political party.

"CANDIDATE" 14(3)**(I)** IN THIS PARAGRAPH, **INCLUDES** Α GOVERNOR AND LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR UNIT. 15

(II) 16 In both primary elections and general elections, when there is 17more than one candidate of the same political party for nomination or election to an office, 18 the names of the candidates in the group shall be listed in alphabetical order by surname. 19In the primary election, candidates for Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be 20arranged in the order of surnames of the gubernatorial candidates] A LOCAL BOARD 21SHALL CONDUCT A RANDOM DRAWING TO DETERMINE THE ORDER OF THE NAMES 22OF THE CANDIDATES FOR AN OFFICE ON THE BALLOT.

23(III) THE DRAWING SHALL BE CONDUCTED IN A MANNER $\mathbf{24}$ **REQUIRED BY THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS.**

25SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 26January 1, 2019.

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
