A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Criminal Law – Violent Offenders – Penalties**
3 **(Accountability for Violent Criminals Act of 2018)**

4 FOR the purpose of increasing the amount of time a certain inmate who is sentenced to life
5 imprisonment must serve before parole eligibility; eliminating parole eligibility for
6 certain violent offenders under certain circumstances; restricting a court from
7 ordering a certain substance use evaluation and commitment for certain defendants
8 charged with, convicted of, or serving a sentence for a crime of violence under certain
9 circumstances; making the provisions of this Act severable; making this Act an
10 emergency measure; and generally relating to crimes of violence.

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
10 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 **Article – Correctional Services**

12 7–301.

13 (d) (1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) [and], (3), AND (4) of this
14 subsection, an inmate who has been sentenced to life imprisonment is not eligible for parole
15 consideration until the inmate has served 15 years or the equivalent of 15 years considering
16 the allowances for diminution of the inmate’s term of confinement under § 6–218 of the
17 Criminal Procedure Article and Title 3, Subtitle 7 of this article.

18 (2) An inmate who has been sentenced to life imprisonment as a result of
19 a proceeding under former § 2–303 or § 2–304 of the Criminal Law Article is not eligible for
20 parole consideration until the inmate has served 25 years or the equivalent of 25 years
21 considering the allowances for diminution of the inmate’s term of confinement under §
22 6–218 of the Criminal Procedure Article and Title 3, Subtitle 7 of this article.

23 (3) (i) If an inmate has been sentenced to imprisonment for life without
24 the possibility of parole under § 2–203 or § 2–304 of the Criminal Law Article, the inmate
25 is not eligible for parole consideration and may not be granted parole at any time during
26 the inmate’s sentence.

27 (ii) This paragraph does not restrict the authority of the Governor to
28 pardon or remit any part of a sentence under § 7–601 of this title.

29 **(4) AN INMATE WHO HAS BEEN SENTENCED TO LIFE IMPRISONMENT**
30 **FOR A CRIME COMMITTED ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF**
31 **CHAPTER ____ (S.B. __/H.B. __)(LR0127) OF THE ACTS OF THE GENERAL**
32 **ASSEMBLY OF 2018 IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR PAROLE CONSIDERATION UNTIL THE**
33 **INMATE HAS SERVED 25 YEARS OR THE EQUIVALENT OF 25 YEARS CONSIDERING THE**
34 **ALLOWANCES FOR DIMINUTION OF THE INMATE’S TERM OF CONFINEMENT UNDER §**
35 **6–218 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE ARTICLE AND TITLE 3, SUBTITLE 7 OF THIS**
36 **ARTICLE.**

- 1 (14) use of a handgun in the commission of a felony or other crime of
2 violence;
- 3 (15) child abuse in the first degree under § 3–601 of this article;
- 4 (16) sexual abuse of a minor under § 3–602 of this article if:
- 5 (i) the victim is under the age of 13 years and the offender is an
6 adult at the time of the offense; and
- 7 (ii) the offense involved:
- 8 1. vaginal intercourse, as defined in § 3–301 of this article;
- 9 2. a sexual act, as defined in § 3–301 of this article;
- 10 3. an act in which a part of the offender’s body penetrates,
11 however slightly, into the victim’s genital opening or anus; or
- 12 4. the intentional touching, not through the clothing, of the
13 victim’s or the offender’s genital, anal, or other intimate area for sexual arousal,
14 gratification, or abuse;
- 15 (17) home invasion under § 6–202(b) of this article;
- 16 (18) an attempt to commit any of the crimes described in items (1) through
17 (17) of this subsection;
- 18 (19) continuing course of conduct with a child under § 3–315 of this article;
- 19 (20) assault in the first degree;
- 20 (21) assault with intent to murder;
- 21 (22) assault with intent to rape;
- 22 (23) assault with intent to rob;
- 23 (24) assault with intent to commit a sexual offense in the first degree; and
- 24 (25) assault with intent to commit a sexual offense in the second degree.

25 (d) (1) **(I) [On] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS**
26 **SUBSECTION, ON** conviction for a second time of a crime of violence committed on or after
27 October 1, 1994, a person shall be sentenced to imprisonment for the term allowed by law,
28 but not less than 10 years, if the person:

1 [(i)] 1. has been convicted on a prior occasion of a crime of
2 violence, including a conviction for a crime committed before October 1, 1994; and

3 [(ii)] 2. served a term of confinement in a correctional facility for
4 that conviction.

5 [(2)] (II) The court may not suspend all or part of the mandatory 10–year
6 sentence required under this [subsection] PARAGRAPH.

7 (2) (I) ON CONVICTION FOR A SECOND TIME OF A CRIME OF
8 VIOLENCE COMMITTED ON OR AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF CHAPTER ____ (S.B.
9 ____/H.B. ____)(LR0127) OF THE ACTS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2018, A
10 PERSON SHALL BE SENTENCED TO IMPRISONMENT FOR THE TERM ALLOWED BY
11 LAW, BUT NOT LESS THAN 10 YEARS, IF THE PERSON:

12 1. HAS BEEN CONVICTED ON A PRIOR OCCASION OF A
13 CRIME OF VIOLENCE, INCLUDING A CONVICTION FOR A CRIME COMMITTED BEFORE
14 THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF CHAPTER ____ (S.B. ____/H.B. ____)(LR0127) OF THE ACTS
15 OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2018; AND

16 2. SERVED A TERM OF CONFINEMENT IN A
17 CORRECTIONAL FACILITY FOR THAT CONVICTION.

18 (II) THE COURT MAY NOT SUSPEND ALL OR PART OF THE
19 MANDATORY 10–YEAR SENTENCE REQUIRED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH.

20 (III) A PERSON SENTENCED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH IS NOT
21 ELIGIBLE FOR PAROLE EXCEPT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF § 4–305
22 OF THE CORRECTIONAL SERVICES ARTICLE.

25 (a) (1) (I) [Before] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS
26 SUBSECTION, BEFORE or during a criminal trial, before or after sentencing, or before or
27 during a term of probation, the court may order the Department to evaluate a defendant to
28 determine whether, by reason of drug or alcohol abuse, the defendant is in need of and may
29 benefit from treatment if:

30 [(i)] 1. It appears to the court that the defendant has an alcohol
31 or drug abuse problem; or

32 [(ii)] 2. The defendant alleges an alcohol or drug dependency.

1 **[(2)] (II)** A court shall set and may change the conditions under which an
2 examination is to be conducted under this section.

3 **[(3)] (III)** The Department shall ensure that each evaluation under this
4 section is conducted in accordance with regulations adopted by the Department.

5 **(2) FOR A DEFENDANT WHO IS CHARGED WITH, CONVICTED OF, OR**
6 **SERVING A SENTENCE FOR A CRIME OF VIOLENCE AS DEFINED UNDER § 14–101 OF**
7 **THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE, A COURT MAY NOT ORDER THE DEPARTMENT TO**
8 **EVALUATE A DEFENDANT UNDER THIS SECTION UNDER ANY OF THE FOLLOWING**
9 **CIRCUMSTANCES:**

10 **(I) BEFORE OR DURING A CRIMINAL TRIAL;**

11 **(II) BEFORE OR AFTER SENTENCING, IF THE COURT HAS**
12 **ORDERED A TERM OF IMPRISONMENT; OR**

13 **(III) FOR A DEFENDANT WHO IS SENTENCED TO IMPRISONMENT**
14 **FOR A CRIME OF VIOLENCE, UNTIL THE DEFENDANT IS ELIGIBLE FOR PAROLE.**

16 (a) **[A] SUBJECT TO THE ELIGIBILITY RESTRICTIONS UNDER § 8–505(A) OF**
17 **THIS SUBTITLE, A court may commit a defendant to the Department for inpatient**
18 **evaluation as to drug or alcohol abuse if:**

19 (1) The court finds it is not clinically appropriate for the defendant to be
20 evaluated in a detention facility or an appropriate outpatient facility; and

22 (a) **(1) [Subject] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS**
23 **SUBSECTION AND SUBJECT** to the limitations in this section, a court that finds in a
24 criminal case or during a term of probation that a defendant has an alcohol or drug
25 dependency may commit the defendant as a condition of release, after conviction, or at any
26 other time the defendant voluntarily agrees to participate in treatment, to the Department
27 for treatment that the Department recommends, even if:

28 **[(1)] (I)** The defendant did not timely file a motion for reconsideration
29 under Maryland Rule 4–345; or

30 **[(2)] (II)** The defendant timely filed a motion for reconsideration under
31 Maryland Rule 4–345 which was denied by the court.

32 **(2) FOR A DEFENDANT WHO IS CHARGED WITH, CONVICTED OF, OR**

1 **SERVING A SENTENCE FOR A CRIME OF VIOLENCE AS DEFINED UNDER § 14–101 OF**
2 **THE CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE, A COURT IN A CRIMINAL CASE MAY NOT COMMIT A**
3 **DEFENDANT TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR TREATMENT UNDER THIS SECTION UNDER**
4 **ANY OF THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES:**

5 **(I) BEFORE OR DURING TRIAL;**

6 **(II) BEFORE OR AFTER SENTENCING, IF THE COURT HAS**
7 **ORDERED A TERM OF IMPRISONMENT; OR**

8 **(III) FOR A DEFENDANT WHO IS SENTENCED TO IMPRISONMENT**
9 **FOR A CRIME OF VIOLENCE, UNTIL THE DEFENDANT IS ELIGIBLE FOR PAROLE.**

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if any provision of this Act or
11 the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid for any reason in a
12 court of competent jurisdiction, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or any other
13 application of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application,
14 and for this purpose the provisions of this Act are declared severable.

15 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
16 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has
17 been passed by a ye and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to
18 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is
19 enacted.
