17 18 19 20 21 22	(b) The agency primarily responsible for traffic control at an intersection monitored by a traffic control signal monitoring system shall ensure that the length of time that a traffic control signal displays a yellow light before changing to a red signal indication is <b>AT LEAST 4 SECONDS AND IS OTHERWISE</b> set in accordance with regulations adopted by the State Highway Administration consistent with standards or guidelines established by the Federal Highway Administration.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

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October 1, 2018.
