 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of requiring the Prince George's County Board of Education to report to 6 the Maryland Department of Health the number of students who did not receive 7 recommended services after failing a hearing or vision screening and the reason why; 8 requiring the county board to develop a certain strategy to increase the number of students receiving recommended services after failing a hearing or vision screening; 9 10 requiring the county board to report annually on its progress in meeting certain goals 11 to the Prince George's County Executive, the Prince George's County Council, and the Prince George's County delegation to the General Assembly; providing for the 12application of this Act; and generally relating to hearing and vision screenings for 13students in Prince George's County. 14

17 [(g)] (H) A student whose parent or guardian objects in writing to hearing and 18 vision screening on the ground that it conflicts with the tenets and practice of a recognized 19 church or religious denomination of which he is an adherent or member may not be required 20 to take these screenings.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 2018.
