A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Public Health - General Hospice Care Programs - Collection and Disposal of Unused Prescription Medication

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a general hospice care program to establish a written unused $\mathbf{5}$ prescription medication collection and disposal policy that includes certain 6 provisions; requiring an employee of a general hospice care program to immediately 7 collect and dispose of a certain patient's unused prescription medication under 8 certain circumstances; requiring a certain employee to provide to the patient or 9 patient's family member or personal representative a certain written request for authorizing the collection and disposal of certain medication; prohibiting an 1011 employee of a general hospice care program from collecting or disposing of certain 12medication without a certain written authorization; requiring a certain employee to 13 urge a certain patient or the patient's family member or personal representative to 14dispose of certain medication in a certain manner under certain circumstances; 15requiring a certain employee, under certain circumstances, to immediately dispose 16of certain medication in accordance with certain guidelines and under the witness of 17certain individuals; requiring that the collection and disposal of certain medication 18 be documented in a patient's medical record; requiring that the medical record 19include certain information; requiring a certain general hospice program employee 20to document a certain refusal and certain other information in a certain patient's 21 medical record under certain circumstances; prohibiting a general hospice care 22program from being held liable in a civil or criminal action under certain 23circumstances; and generally relating to the collection and disposal of unused 24prescription medication by general hospice care programs.

9 (C) IF AUTHORIZED, A GENERAL HOSPICE CARE PROGRAM EMPLOYEE 10 SHALL IMMEDIATELY DISPOSE OF A PATIENT'S UNUSED PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION 11 AT THE SITE WHERE HOSPICE CARE WAS PROVIDED:
