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# <u>Physicians – Licensure – Grounds for Discipline and</u> Interstate Medical Licensure Compact

FOR the purpose of entering into the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact; stating the purpose of the Compact; requiring a physician to meet certain eligibility requirements to receive certain licensure; requiring physicians to designate a certain state as the state of principal license for purposes of registration for certain expedited licensure; authorizing a physician to redesignate a state of principal licensure under certain circumstances; authorizing the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact Commission to develop rules to facilitate redesignation; establishing requirements for application, issuance, fees, and renewal of certain expedited licenses; establishing the Interstate Commission to administer the Compact; requiring the Interstate Commission to establish a database of certain physicians and applicants; requiring member boards to report certain information relating to certain public action or complaints against certain licensed physicians to the Interstate Commission; authorizing certain joint investigations; establishing requirements for certain disciplinary action; establishing the duties and finance powers of the Interstate Commission; providing for the organization and operation of the Interstate Commission; requiring the Interstate Commission to establish certain rules; providing for certain executive, legislative, and judicial oversight of the Compact; requiring the Interstate Commission to enforce certain provisions and rules of the Compact; establishing certain default procedures and requirements for dispute resolution; providing that certain states are eligible to become member states of the

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Compact; establishing procedures for amending the Compact; establishing certain requirements for withdrawal by member states from the Compact; providing for the dissolution of the Compact under certain circumstances; making the provisions of the Compact severable and providing for the application of the Compact; providing for the binding effect of the Compact and other laws; defining certain terms; requiring the State Board of Physicians to set fees for the issuance and renewal of licenses under the Compact; requiring that the fees be set in a certain manner; requiring that any annual assessment levied by the Commission be funded through a certain surcharge; requiring a compact physician to provide certain requested verification to the Board within a certain period of time; prohibiting refusal by a compact physician to provide certain verification from being considered a basis for denial of a certain compact license; requiring a compact physician to submit certain information to the Board within a certain period of time; altering the grounds for discipline of certain licensees of the Board, subject to a certain exception; providing for the construction of this Act; establishing that a certain termination provision constitutes certain withdrawal notice; providing for a delayed effective date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact licensure of physicians.

- 1 THE INTERSTATE MEDICAL LICENSURE COMPACT IS ENACTED INTO LAW AND
- 2 ENTERED INTO WITH ALL OTHER STATES LEGALLY JOINING IN IT IN THE FORM
- 3 SUBSTANTIALLY AS IT APPEARS IN THIS SECTION AS FOLLOWS:

#### 4 SECTION 1. PURPOSE

5 IN ORDER TO STRENGTHEN ACCESS TO HEALTH CARE, AND IN RECOGNITION 6 OF THE ADVANCES IN THE DELIVERY OF HEALTH CARE, THE MEMBER STATES OF THE 7 INTERSTATE MEDICAL LICENSURE COMPACT HAVE ALLIED IN COMMON PURPOSE TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE PROCESS THAT COMPLEMENTS THE EXISTING 8 9 LICENSING AND REGULATORY AUTHORITY OF STATE MEDICAL BOARDS, AND 10 PROVIDES A STREAMLINED PROCESS THAT ALLOWS PHYSICIANS TO BECOME 11 LICENSED IN MULTIPLE STATES, THEREBY ENHANCING THE PORTABILITY OF A MEDICAL LICENSE AND ENSURING THE SAFETY OF PATIENTS. THE COMPACT 12 13 CREATES ANOTHER PATHWAY FOR LICENSURE AND DOES NOT OTHERWISE CHANGE 14 A STATE'S EXISTING MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT. THE COMPACT ALSO ADOPTS THE PREVAILING STANDARD FOR LICENSURE AND AFFIRMS THAT THE PRACTICE OF 15 MEDICINE OCCURS WHERE THE PATIENT IS LOCATED AT THE TIME OF THE 16 17 PHYSICIAN-PATIENT ENCOUNTER, AND THEREFORE REQUIRES THE PHYSICIAN TO 18 BE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE STATE MEDICAL BOARD WHERE THE PATIENT IS LOCATED. STATE MEDICAL BOARDS THAT PARTICIPATE IN THE COMPACT RETAIN 19 20 THE JURISDICTION TO IMPOSE AN ADVERSE ACTION AGAINST A LICENSE TO 21PRACTICE MEDICINE IN THAT STATE ISSUED TO A PHYSICIAN THROUGH THE 22 PROCEDURES IN THE COMPACT.

#### 23 SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS

#### 24 IN THIS COMPACT:

- 25 (A) "BYLAWS" MEANS THOSE BYLAWS ESTABLISHED BY THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION PURSUANT TO SECTION 11 FOR ITS GOVERNANCE, OR FOR DIRECTING
- 27 AND CONTROLLING ITS ACTIONS AND CONDUCT.
- 28 (B) "COMMISSIONER" MEANS THE VOTING REPRESENTATIVE APPOINTED 29 BY EACH MEMBER BOARD PURSUANT TO SECTION 11.
- 30 (C) "CONVICTION" MEANS A FINDING BY A COURT THAT AN INDIVIDUAL IS
- 31 GUILTY OF A CRIMINAL OFFENSE THROUGH ADJUDICATION, OR ENTRY OF A PLEA
- 32 OF GUILT OR NO CONTEST TO THE CHARGE BY THE OFFENDER. EVIDENCE OF AN
- 33 ENTRY OF A CONVICTION OF A CRIMINAL OFFENSE BY THE COURT SHALL BE
- 34 CONSIDERED FINAL FOR PURPOSES OF DISCIPLINARY ACTION BY A MEMBER BOARD.

- 1 (D) "EXPEDITED LICENSE" MEANS A FULL AND UNRESTRICTED MEDICAL LICENSE GRANTED BY A MEMBER STATE TO AN ELIGIBLE PHYSICIAN THROUGH THE PROCESS SET FORTH IN THE COMPACT.
- 4 (E) "INTERSTATE COMMISSION" MEANS THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION 5 CREATED PURSUANT TO SECTION 11.
- 6 (F) "LICENSE" MEANS AUTHORIZATION BY A STATE FOR A PHYSICIAN TO 7 ENGAGE IN THE PRACTICE OF MEDICINE, WHICH WOULD BE UNLAWFUL WITHOUT 8 THE AUTHORIZATION.
- 9 (G) "MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT" MEANS THE LAWS AND REGULATIONS
  10 GOVERNING THE PRACTICE OF ALLOPATHIC AND OSTEOPATHIC MEDICINE WITHIN
  11 A MEMBER STATE.
- 12 (H) "MEMBER BOARD" MEANS A STATE AGENCY IN A MEMBER STATE THAT
  13 ACTS IN THE SOVEREIGN INTERESTS OF THE STATE BY PROTECTING THE PUBLIC
  14 THROUGH LICENSURE, REGULATION, AND EDUCATION OF PHYSICIANS AS DIRECTED
  15 BY THE STATE GOVERNMENT.
- 16 (I) "MEMBER STATE" MEANS A STATE THAT HAS ENACTED THE COMPACT.
- 17 (J) "OFFENSE" MEANS A FELONY, GROSS MISDEMEANOR, OR CRIME OF 18 MORAL TURPITUDE.
- 19 (K) "PHYSICIAN" MEANS ANY PERSON WHO:
- 20 (1) IS A GRADUATE OF A MEDICAL SCHOOL ACCREDITED BY THE 21 LIAISON COMMITTEE ON MEDICAL EDUCATION, THE COMMISSION ON 22 OSTEOPATHIC COLLEGE ACCREDITATION, OR A MEDICAL SCHOOL LISTED IN THE 23 INTERNATIONAL MEDICAL EDUCATION DIRECTORY OR ITS EQUIVALENT;
- 24 (2) PASSED EACH COMPONENT OF THE UNITED STATES MEDICAL
  25 LICENSING EXAMINATION (USMLE) OR THE COMPREHENSIVE OSTEOPATHIC
  26 MEDICAL LICENSING EXAMINATION (COMLEX-USA) WITHIN THREE ATTEMPTS,
  27 OR ANY OF ITS PREDECESSOR EXAMINATIONS ACCEPTED BY A STATE MEDICAL
  28 BOARD AS AN EQUIVALENT EXAMINATION FOR LICENSURE PURPOSES;
- 29 (3) SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION 30 APPROVED BY THE ACCREDITATION COUNCIL FOR GRADUATE MEDICAL 31 EDUCATION OR THE AMERICAN OSTEOPATHIC ASSOCIATION;
- 32 (4) Holds specialty certification or a time-unlimited 33 <del>specialty certificate recognized by the American Board of Medical</del>

- 1 SPECIALTIES OR THE AMERICAN OSTEOPATHIC ASSOCIATION'S BUREAU OF
- 2 OSTEOPATHIC SPECIALISTS:
- 3 (5) (4) POSSESSES A FULL AND UNRESTRICTED LICENSE TO 4 ENGAGE IN THE PRACTICE OF MEDICINE ISSUED BY A MEMBER BOARD;
- 5 (6) (5) HAS NEVER BEEN CONVICTED OF OR RECEIVED
- 6 ADJUDICATION, DEFERRED ADJUDICATION, COMMUNITY SUPERVISION, OR
- 7 DEFERRED DISPOSITION FOR ANY OFFENSE BY A COURT OF APPROPRIATE
- 8 JURISDICTION;
- 9 (7) (6) HAS NEVER HELD A LICENSE AUTHORIZING THE PRACTICE
- 10 OF MEDICINE SUBJECTED TO DISCIPLINE BY A LICENSING AGENCY IN ANY STATE,
- 11 FEDERAL, OR FOREIGN JURISDICTION, EXCLUDING ANY ACTION RELATED TO
- 12 NONPAYMENT OF FEES RELATED TO A LICENSE;
- 13 (8) (7) HAS NEVER HAD A CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE LICENSE OR
- 14 PERMIT SUSPENDED OR REVOKED BY A STATE OR THE UNITED STATES DRUG
- 15 ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION; AND
- 16 (9) (8) IS NOT UNDER ACTIVE INVESTIGATION BY A LICENSING
- 17 AGENCY OR LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY IN ANY STATE, FEDERAL, OR FOREIGN
- 18 JURISDICTION.
- 19 (L) "PRACTICE OF MEDICINE" MEANS THE CLINICAL PREVENTION,
- 20 DIAGNOSIS, OR TREATMENT OF HUMAN DISEASE, INJURY, OR CONDITION
- 21 REQUIRING A PHYSICIAN TO OBTAIN AND MAINTAIN A LICENSE IN COMPLIANCE
- 22 WITH THE MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT OF A MEMBER STATE.
- 23 (M) "RULE" MEANS A WRITTEN STATEMENT BY THE INTERSTATE
- 24 COMMISSION PROMULGATED PURSUANT TO SECTION 12 THAT IS OF GENERAL
- 25 APPLICABILITY, IMPLEMENTS, INTERPRETS, OR PRESCRIBES A POLICY OR
- 26 PROVISION OF THE COMPACT, OR AN ORGANIZATIONAL, PROCEDURAL, OR
- 27 PRACTICE REQUIREMENT OF THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION, AND HAS THE FORCE
- 28 AND EFFECT OF STATUTORY LAW IN A MEMBER STATE, AND INCLUDES THE
- 29 AMENDMENT, REPEAL, OR SUSPENSION OF AN EXISTING RULE.
- 30 (N) "STATE" MEANS ANY STATE, COMMONWEALTH, DISTRICT, OR
- 31 TERRITORY OF THE UNITED STATES.
- 32 (O) "STATE OF PRINCIPAL LICENSE" MEANS A MEMBER STATE WHERE A
- 33 PHYSICIAN HOLDS A LICENSE TO PRACTICE MEDICINE AND THAT HAS BEEN
- 34 DESIGNATED AS SUCH BY THE PHYSICIAN FOR PURPOSES OF REGISTRATION AND
- 35 PARTICIPATION IN THE COMPACT.

#### SECTION 3. ELIGIBILITY

- 2 (A) (1) A PHYSICIAN MUST MEET THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS AS
- 3 DEFINED IN SECTION 2(K) IN ORDER TO RECEIVE AN INITIAL EXPEDITED LICENSE
- 4 UNDER THE TERMS AND PROVISIONS OF THE COMPACT, A PHYSICIAN MUST:
- 5 (I) MEET THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS AS DEFINED IN
- 6 SECTION 2(K); AND

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- 7 (II) HOLD SPECIALTY CERTIFICATION OR A TIME-UNLIMITED
- 8 SPECIALTY CERTIFICATE RECOGNIZED BY THE AMERICAN BOARD OF MEDICAL
- 9 SPECIALTIES OR THE AMERICAN OSTEOPATHIC ASSOCIATION'S BUREAU OF
- 10 OSTEOPATHIC SPECIALISTS.
- 11 (2) A PHYSICIAN IS NOT REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN SPECIALTY
- 12 CERTIFICATION DESCRIBED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF THIS SUBSECTION IN
- 13 ORDER TO RENEW AN EXPEDITED LICENSE UNDER SECTION 6.
- 14 (B) A PHYSICIAN WHO DOES NOT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION
- 2(K) MAY OBTAIN A LICENSE TO PRACTICE MEDICINE IN A MEMBER STATE IF THE
- 16 INDIVIDUAL COMPLIES WITH ALL LAWS AND REQUIREMENTS, OTHER THAN THE
- 17 COMPACT, RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF A LICENSE TO PRACTICE MEDICINE IN
- 18 THAT STATE.

#### 19 SECTION 4. DESIGNATION OF STATE OF PRINCIPAL LICENSE

- 20 (A) A PHYSICIAN SHALL DESIGNATE A MEMBER STATE AS THE STATE OF
- 21 PRINCIPAL LICENSE FOR PURPOSES OF REGISTRATION FOR EXPEDITED LICENSURE
- 22 THROUGH THE COMPACT IF THE PHYSICIAN POSSESSES A FULL AND UNRESTRICTED
- 23 LICENSE TO PRACTICE MEDICINE IN THAT STATE, AND THE STATE IS:
- 24 (1) THE STATE OF PRIMARY RESIDENCE FOR THE PHYSICIAN;
- 25 (2) THE STATE WHERE AT LEAST 25% OF THE PRACTICE OF MEDICINE
- 26 OCCURS;
- 27 (3) THE LOCATION OF THE PHYSICIAN'S EMPLOYER; OR
- 28 (4) If NO STATE QUALIFIES UNDER ITEMS (1), (2), OR (3), THE STATE
- 29 DESIGNATED AS STATE OF RESIDENCE FOR PURPOSE OF FEDERAL INCOME TAX.

- 1 (B) A PHYSICIAN MAY REDESIGNATE A MEMBER STATE AS STATE OF 2 PRINCIPAL LICENSE AT ANY TIME, AS LONG AS THE STATE MEETS THE 3 REQUIREMENTS IN SUBSECTION (A).
- 4 (C) THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION IS AUTHORIZED TO DEVELOP RULES TO 5 FACILITATE REDESIGNATION OF ANOTHER MEMBER STATE AS THE STATE OF 6 PRINCIPAL LICENSE.

#### 7 SECTION 5. APPLICATION AND ISSUANCE OF EXPEDITED LICENSURE

- 8 (A) A PHYSICIAN SEEKING LICENSURE THROUGH THE COMPACT SHALL 9 FILE AN APPLICATION FOR AN EXPEDITED LICENSE WITH THE MEMBER BOARD OF THE STATE SELECTED BY THE PHYSICIAN AS THE STATE OF PRINCIPAL LICENSE.
- 11 (B) (1) ON RECEIPT OF AN APPLICATION FOR AN EXPEDITED LICENSE,
  12 THE MEMBER BOARD WITHIN THE STATE SELECTED AS THE STATE OF PRINCIPAL
  13 LICENSE SHALL EVALUATE WHETHER THE PHYSICIAN IS ELIGIBLE FOR EXPEDITED
  14 LICENSURE AND ISSUE A LETTER OF QUALIFICATION, VERIFYING OR DENYING THE
  15 PHYSICIAN'S ELIGIBILITY, TO THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION.
- 16 (2) STATIC QUALIFICATIONS, WHICH INCLUDE VERIFICATION OF
  17 MEDICAL EDUCATION, GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION, RESULTS OF ANY MEDICAL
  18 OR LICENSING EXAMINATION, AND OTHER QUALIFICATIONS AS DETERMINED BY THE
  19 INTERSTATE COMMISSION THROUGH RULE, MAY NOT BE SUBJECT TO ADDITIONAL
  20 PRIMARY SOURCE VERIFICATION WHERE ALREADY PRIMARY SOURCE VERIFIED BY
  21 THE STATE OF PRINCIPAL LICENSE.
- 22**(3)** (I)THE MEMBER BOARD WITHIN THE STATE SELECTED AS THE STATE OF PRINCIPAL LICENSE SHALL, IN THE COURSE OF VERIFYING ELIGIBILITY, 23 PERFORM REQUIRE THE APPLICANT TO OBTAIN A CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECK 24OF AN APPLICANT AS REQUIRED UNDER § 14-308.1 OF THIS TITLE, INCLUDING THE 2526 USE OF THE RESULTS OF FINGERPRINT OR OTHER BIOMETRIC DATA CHECKS COMPLIANT WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE FEDERAL BUREAU OF 27 INVESTIGATION, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF FEDERAL EMPLOYEES WHO HAVE 28SUITABILITY DETERMINATION IN ACCORDANCE WITH U.S. C.F.R. § 731.202. 29
- 30 (II) THE MEMBER BOARD MAY NOT DISCLOSE TO THE 31 INTERSTATE COMMISSION ANY INFORMATION RECEIVED FROM THE FEDERAL 32 BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION THAT IS PROVIDED IN A BACKGROUND CHECK OF AN 33 APPLICANT PERFORMED UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH.
- 34 **(4)** AN APPEAL ON THE DETERMINATION OF ELIGIBILITY SHALL BE 35 MADE TO THE MEMBER STATE, IF AN APPEAL IS ALLOWED UNDER THE LAWS OF THAT

- 1 STATE, WHERE THE APPLICATION WAS FILED AND SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE LAW OF THAT STATE.
- 3 (C) ON VERIFICATION IN SUBSECTION (B), PHYSICIANS ELIGIBLE FOR AN 4 EXPEDITED LICENSE SHALL COMPLETE THE REGISTRATION PROCESS ESTABLISHED
- 5 BY THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION TO RECEIVE A LICENSE IN A MEMBER STATE
- 6 SELECTED PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (A), INCLUDING THE PAYMENT OF ANY
- 7 APPLICABLE FEES.
- 8 (D) AFTER RECEIVING VERIFICATION OF ELIGIBILITY UNDER SUBSECTION
- 9 (B) AND ANY FEES UNDER SUBSECTION (C), A MEMBER BOARD SHALL ISSUE AN
- 10 EXPEDITED LICENSE TO THE PHYSICIAN. THIS LICENSE SHALL AUTHORIZE THE

- 8 (19) MAINTAIN RECORDS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE BYLAWS;
- 9 (20) SEEK AND OBTAIN TRADEMARKS, COPYRIGHTS, AND PATENTS; 10 AND
- 11 (21) PERFORM SUCH FUNCTIONS AS MAY BE NECESSARY OR APPROPRIATE TO ACHIEVE THE PURPOSES OF THE COMPACT. 12

#### SECTION 13. FINANCE POWERS 13

- THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A YEARLY 2728FINANCIAL AUDIT CONDUCTED BY A CERTIFIED OR LICENSED PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT 29 AND THE REPORT OF THE AUDIT SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION. 30
- 31 SECTION 14. ORGANIZATION AND OPERATION OF THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION 32

- 36 (3) THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION SHALL DEFEND THE EXECUTIVE 37 DIRECTOR, ITS EMPLOYEES, AND SUBJECT TO THE APPROVAL OF THE ATTORNEY 38 GENERAL OR OTHER APPROPRIATE LEGAL COUNSEL OF THE MEMBER STATE 39 REPRESENTED BY AN INTERSTATE COMMISSION REPRESENTATIVE, SHALL DEFEND

- SUCH INTERSTATE COMMISSION REPRESENTATIVE IN ANY CIVIL ACTION SEEKING 1

- AGAINST SUCH PERSONS ARISING OUT OF AN ACTUAL OR ALLEGED ACT, ERROR, OR 14
- OMISSION THAT OCCURRED WITHIN THE SCOPE OF INTERSTATE COMMISSION 15
- 16 EMPLOYMENT, DUTIES, OR RESPONSIBILITIES, OR THAT SUCH PERSONS HAD A

- 35 (C) NOT LATER THAN THIRTY (30) DAYS AFTER A RULE IS PROMULGATED,
- ANY PERSON MAY FILE A PETITION FOR JUDICIAL REVIEW OF THE RULE IN THE 36
- UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT FOR THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA OR THE 37
- 38 FEDERAL DISTRICT WHERE THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION HAS ITS PRINCIPAL
- 39 OFFICES, PROVIDED THAT THE FILING OF SUCH A PETITION SHALL NOT STAY OR

- 17 PERTAINING TO THE SUBJECT MATTER OF THE COMPACT THAT MAY AFFECT THE
- 18 POWERS, RESPONSIBILITIES, OR ACTIONS OF THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION.
- 19 THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION SHALL BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE ALL
- SERVICE OF PROCESS IN ANY SUCH PROCEEDING, AND SHALL HAVE STANDING TO 20
- 21INTERVENE IN THE PROCEEDING FOR ALL PURPOSES. FAILURE TO PROVIDE
- 22 SERVICE OF PROCESS TO THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION SHALL RENDER A
- 23 JUDGMENT OR AN ORDER VOID AS TO THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION, THE
- 24COMPACT, OR PROMULGATED RULES.

#### SECTION 17. ENFORCEMENT OF INTERSTATE COMPACT 25

- 32 COMMISSION HAS ITS PRINCIPAL OFFICES, TO ENFORCE COMPLIANCE WITH THE
- 33 PROVISIONS OF THE COMPACT, AND ITS PROMULGATED RULES AND BYLAWS,
- AGAINST A MEMBER STATE IN DEFAULT. THE RELIEF SOUGHT MAY INCLUDE BOTH 34
- INJUNCTIVE RELIEF AND DAMAGES. IN THE EVENT JUDICIAL ENFORCEMENT IS 35
- 36 NECESSARY, THE PREVAILING PARTY SHALL BE AWARDED ALL COSTS OF SUCH
- 37 LITIGATION INCLUDING REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES.

1 THE REMEDIES HEREIN SHALL NOT BE THE EXCLUSIVE REMEDIES OF

2 THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION. THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION MAY AVAIL ITSELF

- 14 PROVIDE WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE DEFAULTING STATE AND OTHER MEMBER STATES, OF THE NATURE OF THE DEFAULT, THE MEANS OF CURING 15 16 THE DEFAULT, AND ANY ACTION TAKEN BY THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION. THE 17 INTERSTATE COMMISSION SHALL SPECIFY THE CONDITIONS BY WHICH THE DEFAULTING STATE MUST CURE ITS DEFAULT; AND 18
- 19 **(2)** PROVIDE REMEDIAL TRAINING AND SPECIFIC TECHNICAL 20 ASSISTANCE REGARDING THE DEFAULT.
- 21IF THE DEFAULTING STATE FAILS TO CURE THE DEFAULT, THE 22DEFAULTING STATE SHALL BE TERMINATED FROM THE COMPACT ON AN 23 AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF THE COMMISSIONERS AND ALL RIGHTS, 24PRIVILEGES, AND BENEFITS CONFERRED BY THE COMPACT SHALL TERMINATE ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF TERMINATION. A CURE OF THE DEFAULT DOES NOT 2526 RELIEVE THE OFFENDING STATE OF OBLIGATIONS OR LIABILITIES INCURRED 27 DURING THE PERIOD OF THE DEFAULT.
- 28TERMINATION OF MEMBERSHIP IN THE COMPACT SHALL BE IMPOSED ONLY AFTER ALL OTHER MEANS OF SECURING COMPLIANCE HAVE BEEN 29 EXHAUSTED. NOTICE OF INTENT TO TERMINATE SHALL BE GIVEN BY THE 30 INTERSTATE COMMISSION TO THE GOVERNOR, THE MAJORITY AND MINORITY 31 LEADERS OF THE DEFAULTING STATE'S LEGISLATURE, AND EACH OF THE MEMBER 32
- 33 STATES.
- 34 THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION SHALL ESTABLISH RULES AND 35 PROCEDURES TO ADDRESS LICENSES AND PHYSICIANS THAT ARE MATERIALLY

- 1 IMPACTED BY THE TERMINATION OF A MEMBER STATE, OR THE WITHDRAWAL OF A
- 2 MEMBER STATE.
- 3 (F) THE MEMBER STATE THAT HAS BEEN TERMINATED IS RESPONSIBLE
- 4 FOR ALL DUES, OBLIGATIONS, AND LIABILITIES INCURRED THROUGH THE
- 5 EFFECTIVE DATE OF TERMINATION INCLUDING OBLIGATIONS, THE PERFORMANCE
- 6 OF WHICH EXTENDS BEYOND THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF TERMINATION.
- 7 (G) THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION MAY NOT BEAR ANY COSTS RELATING TO

- 11 (H) THE DEFAULTING STATE MAY APPEAL THE ACTION OF THE INTERSTATE
- 12 COMMISSION BY PETITIONING THE UNITED STATES DISTRICT COURT FOR THE
- 13 DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA OR THE FEDERAL DISTRICT WHERE THE INTERSTATE

- 24 SECTION 20. MEMBER STATES, EFFECTIVE DATE AND AMENDMENT
- 25 (A) ANY STATE IS ELIGIBLE TO BECOME A MEMBER STATE OF THE 26 COMPACT.
- 27 (B) THE COMPACT SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE AND BINDING ON
- 28 LEGISLATIVE ENACTMENT OF THE COMPACT INTO LAW BY NO LESS THAN SEVEN (7)
- 29 STATES. THEREAFTER, IT SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE AND BINDING ON A STATE ON
- 30 ENACTMENT OF THE COMPACT INTO LAW BY THAT STATE.
- 31 (C) THE GOVERNORS OF NONMEMBER STATES, OR THEIR DESIGNEES,
- 32 SHALL BE INVITED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ACTIVITIES OF THE INTERSTATE
- 33 COMMISSION ON A NONVOTING BASIS PRIOR TO ADOPTION OF THE COMPACT BY ALL
- 34 STATES.

- 1 (D) THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION MAY PROPOSE AMENDMENTS TO THE
- 2 COMPACT FOR ENACTMENT BY THE MEMBER STATES. NO AMENDMENT SHALL
- 3 BECOME EFFECTIVE AND BINDING ON THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION AND THE
- 4 MEMBER STATES UNLESS AND UNTIL IT IS ENACTED INTO LAW BY UNANIMOUS
- 5 CONSENT OF THE MEMBER STATES.

#### 6 SECTION 21. WITHDRAWAL

- 7 (A) ONCE EFFECTIVE, THE COMPACT SHALL CONTINUE IN FORCE AND

- 16 (C) THE WITHDRAWING STATE SHALL IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY THE
- 17 CHAIRPERSON OF THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION IN WRITING ON THE
- 18 INTRODUCTION OF LEGISLATION REPEALING THE COMPACT IN THE WITHDRAWING
- 19 **STATE.**
- 20 (D) THE INTERSTATE COMMISSION SHALL NOTIFY THE OTHER MEMBER
- 21 STATES OF THE WITHDRAWING STATE'S INTENT TO WITHDRAW WITHIN SIXTY (60)
- 22 DAYS OF ITS RECEIPT OF NOTICE PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (C).
- 23 (E) THE WITHDRAWING STATE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL DUES,
- 24 OBLIGATIONS, AND LIABILITIES INCURRED THROUGH THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF
- 25 WITHDRAWAL, INCLUDING OBLIGATIONS, THE PERFORMANCE OF WHICH EXTEND
- 26 BEYOND THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF WITHDRAWAL.
- 27 (F) REINSTATEMENT FOLLOWING WITHDRAWAL OF A MEMBER STATE
- 28 SHALL OCCUR ON THE WITHDRAWING STATE REENACTING THE COMPACT OR ON
