Harford County – Alcoholic Beverages – Clubs, Firehouses, and Multiple Event Licenses

- FOR the purpose of authorizing a holder of a certain Class C-1 (organization or club), C-2 4 5 (organization or club), or C-3 (country club, topiary garden, or yacht or boat club) 6 license in Harford County to sell or provide beer, wine, or liquor for on-premises 7 consumption by certain nonmembers and guests under certain circumstances; 8 authorizing a fire department in Harford County that holds a multiple event beer 9 and wine license to sell or provide beer and wine for on-premises consumption at an entertainment event held by the fire department or by a person that has rented or 10 11 leased an area of the licensed premises; requiring the fire department to contract to 12 provide food for consumption at a certain event; repealing the Class C-3 multiple 13 event (on-sale) beer, wine, and liquor license in Harford County; and generally 14 relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Harford County.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 4 5 Article - Alcoholic Beverages 6 22-102.7 This title applies only in Harford County. 8 22 - 907.There is: 9 (a) 10 (1) a 6-day Class C-1 (organization or club) beer, wine, and liquor license; 11 and 12(2) a 7-day Class C-1 (organization or club) beer, wine, and liquor license. 13 The Board may issue the 6-day license or the 7-day license for use by a war 14 veterans' organization that: is a nationally chartered nonprofit organization or club; 15 (1) 16 (2)has been incorporated for at least 5 years immediately preceding filing 17 of the application for the license; 18 (3)is composed only of members who served in the armed forces of the 19 United States in a war in which the United States has been engaged; 20 **(4)** operates only for the use of members of the war veterans' organization 21and guests accompanied by members; and 22(5)meets in a clubhouse that is principally used for club purposes. 23The 6-day license authorizes the license holder to sell or provide beer, (c) 24wine, and liquor from Monday through Saturday at a club at the place described in the 25license, for on-premises consumption by members and guests. 26 The 7-day license authorizes the license holder to sell or provide beer, 27 wine, and liquor from Monday through Sunday at a club at the place described in the 28license, for on-premises consumption by members and guests.





- 1 (II) BY A PERSON WHO HAS RENTED OR LEASED AN AREA OF THE LICENSED PREMISES FOR AN EVENT AND GUESTS WHO ATTEND THE EVENT.
- 3 (2) THE LICENSE HOLDER MUST ALSO CONTRACT TO PROVIDE FOOD 4 FOR CONSUMPTION AT THE EVENT DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH(1)(II) OF THIS 5 SUBSECTION.
- 6 (3) This section does not prohibit a fire department from obtaining a Class 7 C per diem license.
