4 FOR the purpose of altering the title of the Chief Executive Officer of the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners to be the Superintendent of the Baltimore City Board $\mathbf{5}$ 6 of School Commissioners; altering certain definitions; requiring the publisher of the 7 Annotated Code of Maryland, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the 8 Department of Legislative Services, to correct any cross-references or terminology 9 rendered incorrect by this Act and to describe any corrections made in an editor's 10 note following the section affected; and generally relating to the title change of the 11 Chief Executive Officer of the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners.

14 **[(g)] (F)** "Public school facility" means a building, parking facility, athletic 15 facility, testing facility, or other facility in the City of Baltimore, now existing or hereafter 16 acquired or constructed, that is used by the board in relation to the education of students 17 in the Baltimore City Public School System.
