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## 1 AN ACT concerning

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## **Health Insurance - Access to Local Health Departments**

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a carrier that is an insurer, a nonprofit health service plan, 4 or a health maintenance organization, except for a group model health maintenance 5 organization, to ensure in certain standards that certain enrollees have access to 6 local health departments and certain services provided through local health 7 departments to the extent that local health departments are willing to participate 8 on a carrier's provider panel; requiring that a certain access plan filed by a carrier, 9 except for an access plan filed by a group model health maintenance organization, 10 include a description of the carrier's efforts to include local health departments in 11 the carrier's network; defining a certain term; providing for the application of this 12 Act; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to access to health 13 care services provided through local health departments.
