## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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### **Correctional Officers' Retirement System – Membership**

3 FOR the purpose of altering the membership of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System to include certain individuals serving in certain positions in the Department 4  $\mathbf{5}$ of Public Safety and Correctional Services; providing that certain members of the 6 Correctional Officers' Retirement System who meet certain criteria may receive a 7 normal service retirement allowance that is based on certain creditable service; 8 requiring the State Retirement Agency, on or before a certain date, to notify certain 9 individuals affected by this Act of their right to transfer certain service credit to the Correctional Officers' Retirement System; and generally relating to membership in 10 11 the Correctional Officers' Retirement System.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
  That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this subtitle applies onlyto:
- 23 (1) correctional officers serving in any of the first six job classifications;
- 24 (2) security attendants at Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center;
