## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## Department of Information Technology – Remote Access Information Program – Establishment

FOR the purpose of establishing the Remote Access Information Program in the Department of Information Technology to connect an individual who is deaf-blind with a human assistant using certain remote assistive technology; establishing certain requirements for certain remote assistive technology provided under the Program; requiring the Department of Information Technology and the Department of Disabilities to adopt certain regulations to implement the Program; requiring the Department of Information Technology to enter into a certain agreement with the Department of Disabilities to provide for a certain annual payment; providing that under a certain agreement, the Department of Disabilities is required to contract with a nonprofit entity that has certain experience to determine criteria and a process for selecting certain individuals who qualify for the Program and provide certain eligible individuals with certain remote assistive technology; requiring that the Program be funded as provided in the State budget; altering the purpose of the Universal Service Trust Fund; requiring the costs of the Program to be funded by revenues generated by a certain surcharge and certain other funds; requiring the Secretary to annually certify to the Public Service Commission the costs of the Program to be paid by the Fund for a certain fiscal year; requiring the Commission to determine the surcharge for a certain fiscal year necessary to fund the Program; authorizing the Legislative Auditor to conduct postaudits of a fiscal and compliance nature of the Fund and the expenditures made for purposes of the Program; defining certain terms; and generally relating to the Remote Access Information Program.


