22	of State Police has knowledge that the missing person has been located.

24	(a) (1) A law enforcement agency may not establish a mandatory waiting
25	period before taking a missing person report.
26	(2) <u>A law enforcement agency shall make every effort to inform the general</u>
27	public and the family of a missing person that the agency does not impose a mandatory
