The Department shall advertise 11 the time, place, and purpose of the hearings in one newspaper of general daily circulation 12 in the State, and at least in one newspaper circulated in the affected region of each county 13 whose waters may be directly affected by the proposed regulations at least once per week 14 for 2 successive weeks in advance of the hearings.
