- FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "qualifying nonprofit organization" to 4 authorize certain nonprofit entities to qualify for participation in the State Employee 5 6 and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program; authorizing an employee of a 7 county board to participate in the Program; establishing the Task Force to Study 8 Cooperative Purchasing for Health Insurance; providing for the composition, chair, 9 and staffing of the Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving 10 certain compensation, but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses: 11 requiring the Task Force to study and make certain recommendations regarding cooperative purchasing of health insurance; requiring the Task Force to report its 12 13 findings and recommendations to the Governor and General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of certain provisions of this Act; defining 14 15 a certain term; making conforming changes; and generally relating to the State 16 Employee and Retiree Health and Welfare Benefits Program.


