- 1 (2) Unless a person is restrained by a seat belt, the person may not be a passenger in an outboard front seat of a motor vehicle.
- 3 (3) (i) Unless a person is restrained by a seat belt, the person may not 4 be a passenger in a rear seat of a motor vehicle.
- 5 (ii) A police officer may enforce this paragraph only as a secondary 6 action when the police officer detains a driver of a motor vehicle for a suspected violation of another provision of the Code.
- 8 (k) Any person convicted of a violation of this section is subject to a fine of not 9 more than \$50, INCLUDING COURT COSTS.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2018.
