#### 1 AN ACT concerning

## State Real Estate Commission – Brokers – Business Succession in the Event of Disability

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain adult family members of a disabled real estate  $\mathbf{5}$ broker to carry on the business of the disabled broker for a certain period of time for 6 certain purposes subject to certain qualifications; requiring certain family members 7 to surrender a certain certificate and pocket card and submit certain information to 8 the State Real Estate Commission under certain circumstances; requiring the 9 Commission to reissue certain licenses under certain circumstances; authorizing 10 certain individuals to qualify for a certain license under certain circumstances; 11 authorizing certain licenses to be held for certain periods of time; requiring certain 12individuals to renew a certain license under a certain provision of law; providing for 13 the automatic expiration of certain licenses under certain circumstances; defining a certain term; and generally relating to the succession of a business in the event of 14 15the disability of a real estate broker.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

# 3(a)IN THIS SECTION, "DISABILITY" MEANS A TOTAL AND PERMANENT4DISABILITY THAT RENDERS A BROKER UNABLE TO PERFORM REAL ESTATE5BROKERAGE SERVICES.

6 (B) Subject to the provisions of subsection (b) (C) of this section, on the 7 DISABILITY OR death of a licensed real estate broker, any adult member of the family of 8 the DISABLED OR deceased broker may carry on the business of the DISABLED OR 9 deceased broker for up to 6 months for the purposes of closing and terminating the business.

10 (b) (C) To qualify to carry on the business of a **DISABLED OR** deceased real 11 estate broker, a family member shall:

(1) surrender the license certificate and pocket card of the DISABLED OR
 deceased real estate broker to the Commission; and

14 (2) submit to the Commission any information or documentation required 15 by the Commission.

(c) (D) (1) The Commission shall reissue the license of a DISABLED OR
 deceased real estate broker to a family member who qualifies to carry on the business of
 the broker under subsection (b) (C) of this section.

The term of the reissuance shall be 6 months.

20 (d) (E) Before the end of the 6-month period for carrying on the business of a
 21 DISABLED OR deceased real estate broker, an individual may qualify for the license of the
 22 DISABLED OR deceased broker if:

(1) the individual is a member of the immediate family of the DISABLED
OR deceased broker;

25 (2) the individual has been continuously licensed as a real estate 26 salesperson for the immediately preceding 3 years;

(3) regardless of whether the individual has met the educational
requirements for a real estate broker license under § 17–305 of this subtitle, the individual
passes the real estate broker's examination under § 17–306 of this subtitle;

30 (4) the individual surrenders the real estate salesperson license certificate
 31 and pocket card of the individual to the Commission; and

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1 (5) there has been compliance with the requirements of subsection (b) (C) 2 of this section.

3 (e) (F) The Commission shall reissue the license of a **DISABLED OR** deceased real 4 estate broker to an individual who qualifies for the license of the broker under subsection 5 (d) (E) of this section.

6 (f) (G) (1) An individual who qualifies for and is reissued the license of a 7 **DISABLED OR** deceased real estate broker may hold the license for up to 4 years from the 8 time of reissuance without meeting the educational requirements for a real estate broker 9 license under § 17–305 of this subtitle.

10 (2) Subject to the 4-year restriction under paragraph (1) of this subsection, 11 an individual who has been reissued the license of a **DISABLED OR** deceased real estate 12 broker is responsible for renewing the license as required under § 17–314 of this subtitle.

(3) If an individual who has been reissued the license of a DISABLED OR
 deceased real estate broker does not meet the educational requirements for a real estate
 broker license within the 4-year period, the license shall expire automatically at the end of
 that period.

17 (4) If an individual who has been reissued the license of a **DISABLED OR** 18 deceased real estate broker meets the educational requirements for a real estate broker 19 license within the 4-year period, the individual may continue to hold the license and may 20 renew the license under § 17–314 of this subtitle.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 2018.
