1 AN ACT concerning

Pharmacists - Dispensing of Prescription Drugs - Single Dispensing of Dosage Units

- FOR the purpose of authorizing, with a certain exception, a pharmacist to dispense, in a
 single dispensing and exercising the pharmacist's professional judgment, a quantity
 of a prescription drug that is up to a certain number of authorized dosage units and
 does not exceed a certain supply of the prescription drug; providing that this Act does
 not apply to a certain controlled dangerous substance, certain prescriptions that an
 authorized prescriber prescribes for a patient, or a certain supply of prescription
 contraceptives; defining a certain term; and generally relating to pharmacists and
