A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Health – University of Maryland Medical System – Grant**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing, notwithstanding any other provision of law, certain funds
4 from the Maryland Trauma Physician Services Fund for a certain fiscal year to be
5 used to provide a grant to the University of Maryland Medical System to establish a
6 certain partnership for the purpose of immunotherapy research; requiring the
7 Governor to include in the budget bill a certain appropriation for a certain grant;
8 providing that the grant is in addition to and may not supplant the funds of the
9 University of Maryland Medical System; and generally relating to a grant to the
10 University of Maryland Medical System for immunotherapy research.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That, notwithstanding any other provision of law, for fiscal year 2020 only, \$2,500,000 from
13 the Maryland Trauma Physician Services Fund, established under § 19–130 of the Health
14 – General Article, may be used to provide a grant to the University of Maryland Medical
15 System to establish a partnership between the Institute of Human Virology, the University
16 of Maryland School of Medicine, and the University of Maryland Medical System for the
17 purpose of immunotherapy research.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

19 (a) For fiscal year 2020, the Governor shall include in the budget bill an
20 appropriation of \$2,500,000 to provide a grant to the University of Maryland Medical
21 System for the purpose of immunotherapy research.

22 (b) The grant shall be in addition to and may not supplant the funds of the
23 University of Maryland Medical System.

24 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
25 1, 2018.
