BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Alcoholic Beverages Section 2–132.2 Annotated Code of Maryland (2016 Volume and 2017 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Alcoholic Beverages
