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## CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Corporations and Associations – Resident Agent – Quantity and Resignation**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring a Maryland corporation, a limited liability partnership, a  
4 limited partnership, and a Maryland statutory trust to have a resident agent, rather  
5 than at least one resident agent; altering the circumstances that determine when a  
6 resignation of a resident agent for certain business entities is effective; and generally  
7 relating to business entities and resident agents.

10 Section 2–108(a) and (d), 4A–210(d), 7–205(e), 9A–1005(a) and (d), 10–104(a) and (d),  
11 and 12–203(a) and (d)

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,  
15 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article – Corporations and Associations**

17 2–108.

18 (a) Each Maryland corporation shall have:

1 (1) A principal office in this State; and

2 (2) [At least one] A resident agent.

3 (d) (1) A resident agent may resign by filing with the Department a  
4 counterpart or photocopy of his signed resignation.

5 (2) Unless a later time is specified in the resignation, it is effective:

6 (i) At the time it is filed with the Department, if the corporation has  
7 [more than one] **APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent; or

8 (ii) Ten days after it is filed with the Department, if the corporation  
9 has [only one] **NOT APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent.

10 4A-210.

11 (d) (1) A resident agent may resign by filing with the Department a  
12 counterpart or photocopy of the signed resignation.

13 (2) Unless a later time is specified in the resignation, it is effective:

14 (i) At the time it is filed with the Department, if the limited liability  
15 company has [more than 1] **APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent; or

16 (ii) 10 days after it is filed with the Department, if the limited  
17 liability company has [only 1] **NOT APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent.

18 7-205.

19 (e) (1) A resident agent of a foreign corporation may resign by filing with the  
20 Department a counterpart or photocopy of his signed resignation.

21 (2) Unless a later time is specified in the resignation, it is effective:

22 (i) At the time it is filed with the Department, if the corporation has  
23 [more than one] **APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent; or

24 (ii) Ten days after it is filed with the Department, if the corporation  
25 has [only one] **NOT APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent.

26 9A-1005.

27 (a) Limited liability partnerships shall have:

1 (1) A principal office in the State; and

2 (2) [At least one] A resident agent who shall be:

3 (i) A citizen of this State who resides in the State;

4 (ii) A Maryland corporation; or

5 (iii) A Maryland limited liability company.

6 (d) (1) A resident agent may resign by filing with the Department a  
7 counterpart or photocopy of the signed resignation.

8 (2) Unless a later time is specified in the resignation, it is effective:

9 (i) At the time it is filed with the Department, if the limited liability  
10 partnership has [more than one] **APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent; or

11 (ii) 10 days after it is filed with the Department, if the limited  
12 liability partnership has [only one] **NOT APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent.

13 10–104.

14 (a) Each limited partnership shall have:

15 (1) A principal office in this State; and

16 (2) [At least one] A resident agent.

17 (d) (1) A resident agent may resign by filing with the Department a  
18 counterpart or photocopy of his signed resignation.

19 (2) Unless a later time is specified in the resignation, it is effective:

20 (i) At the time it is filed with the Department, if the limited  
21 partnership has [more than one] **APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent; or

22 (ii) 10 days after it is filed with the Department, if the limited  
23 partnership has [only one] **NOT APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent.

24 12–203.

25 (a) A Maryland statutory trust shall have:

26 (1) A principal office in this State; and

1 (2) [At least one] **A** resident agent.

2 (d) (1) A resident agent may resign by filing with the Department a  
3 counterpart or photocopy of the resident agent’s signed resignation.

4 (2) Unless a later time is specified in the resignation, the resignation is  
5 effective:

6 (i) At the time it is filed with the Department, if the statutory trust  
7 has [more than one] **APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent; or

8 (ii) 10 days after it is filed with the Department, if the statutory  
9 trust has [only one] **NOT APPOINTED A SUCCESSOR** resident agent.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
11 October 1, 2018.
