BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Public Utilities Section 10-404 Annotated Code of Maryland (2010 Replacement Volume and 2017 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Public Utilities

- 1 An operator may not provide transportation network services unless the 2 Commission has authorized the operator to operate on a provisional basis or has issued a 3 valid temporary or permanent transportation network operator's license to provide 4 transportation network services.
- 5 (b) The Commission may approve an applicant to be an operator and issue a 6 temporary transportation network operator's license to the applicant if:
- 7 the applicant provides all information that the Commission requires for (1) 8 the application, including the information specified in item (2) of this subsection; and
- the Commission is satisfied with the successful submission of the 9 (2) applicant's: 10
- (i) 11 national criminal history records check:
- 12 1. conducted by a consumer reporting agency as defined 13 under § 14–1201 of the Commercial Law Article or a comparable entity approved by the 14 Commission; and
- 2. that includes: 15
- 16 A. a Multi-State Multi-Jurisdiction Criminal Records 17 Database Search or a search of a similar nationwide database with validation:
- B. 18 a search of the Sex Offender Registry; and
- C. a search of the U.S. Department of Justice's National Sex 19 20 Offender Public Web site: and
- 21(ii) driving record check that includes a driving history research 22report.
- 23(c) Subject to subsection (d) of this section, the Commission may issue a 24permanent transportation network operator's license to an applicant upon the submission 25of a satisfactory supplemental criminal background check as set forth under § 10–104(b) of 26 this title.
- 27 Before December 15, 2016, the Commission may not require an applicant for 28 a permanent transportation network operator's license to comply with subsection (c) of this 29 section if a transportation network company for which the applicant will provide services, at the time it applies for a permit, provides to the Commission details of the process the 30 transportation network company uses to collect, review, and submit the information 32 specified in subsection (b)(2) of this section.
- 33 A transportation network company may request that the Commission 34 waive the requirement to comply with subsection (c) of this section and instead require

- compliance with subsection (b)(2) of this section for applicants and operators of the 1 2 transportation network company. 3 On receipt of a request under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the Commission shall: 4 determine whether the transportation network company's 5 process for complying with subsection (b)(2) of this section can be shown to be as 6 7 comprehensive and accurate as complying with the supplemental criminal background 8 check as set forth under § 10–104(b) of this title; and 9 (ii) within 3 months after receiving the request, determine whether 10 to: 1. 11 grant the waiver; 12 2. deny the waiver; or 13 3. approve an alternative process. 14 A transportation network company may submit the information under 15 subsection (b) of this section on behalf of an operator. 16 (g) The Commission shall adopt regulations that provide a process that is as 17 expeditious as possible and uses electronic means for: 18 (1) the submission of the information under subsection (b) of this section; 19 the issuance of a temporary or permanent transportation network (2)20 operator's license and alternative authority to operate on a provisional basis; and 21(3)the renewal of a transportation network operator's license. 22 (h) Records or information provided to the Commission by a transportation (1)23network company under this section are not subject to release under the Maryland Public Information Act. 2425The Commission may not disclose records or information provided to (2)26 the Commission under this section to any person unless: 27 (i) the disclosure is required by STATUTE, court order, or order of 28the Maryland Tax Court; or
