1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Harford County – Board of License Commissioners – Temporary License**
3 **Application**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting, in Harford County, the Board of License Commissioners
5 from requiring applications for certain temporary licenses to include copies of a
6 catering contract or menu for the licensed event, or the signature of the owner of the
7 property where the licensed event is to be held, ~~or a notarized application~~; and
8 generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Harford County.

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
4 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

6 22–102.

7 This title applies only in Harford County.

8 22–1301.

9 (a) The following sections of Title 4, Subtitle 12 (“Temporary Licenses”) of
10 Division I of this article apply in the county without exception or variation:

11 (1) § 4–1202 (“Per diem licenses”);

12 [(2) § 4–1203 (“Class C per diem beer and Class C per diem beer and wine
13 licenses”);

14 (3) § 4–1204 (“Class C per diem beer, wine, and liquor license”);]

15 [(4) (2) § 4–1206 (“License to dispose of stock”);

16 [(5) (3) § 4–1207 (“Temporary move of licensed premises”);

17 [(6) (4) § 4–1208 (“Hours and days of sale”); and

18 [(7) (5) § 4–1209 (“Wine permit for fund–raising event”).

19 (b) Section 4–1205 (“License fees”) of Division I of this article does not apply in
20 the county and is superseded by § 22–1309 of this subtitle.

21 (c) **THE FOLLOWING SECTIONS OF TITLE 4, SUBTITLE 12 (“TEMPORARY
22 LICENSES”) OF DIVISION I OF THIS ARTICLE APPLY IN THE COUNTY:**

23 **(1) § 4–1203 (“CLASS C PER DIEM BEER AND CLASS C PER DIEM BEER
24 AND WINE LICENSES”), SUBJECT TO § 22–1302 OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND**

25 **(2) § 4–1204 (“CLASS C PER DIEM BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR
26 LICENSE”), SUBJECT TO § 22–1302 OF THIS SUBTITLE.**

27 **22–1302.**

1 THE BOARD MAY NOT REQUIRE AN APPLICANT FOR A CLASS C PER DIEM BEER
2 LICENSE, A CLASS C PER DIEM BEER AND WINE LICENSE, OR A CLASS C PER DIEM
3 BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR LICENSE TO SUBMIT TO THE BOARD:

4 (1) A COPY OF THE CATERING CONTRACT OR MENU FOR THE
5 LICENSED EVENT; OR

6 (2) THE SIGNATURE OF THE OWNER OF THE PROPERTY WHERE THE
7 LICENSED EVENT IS TO BE HELD; ~~OR~~

8 ~~(3) A NOTARIZED APPLICATION.~~

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
10 1, 2018.
