A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Emergency Medical Services – Emergency Medical Services Board –**
3 **Appointments**

4 FOR the purpose of repealing a provision that prohibits the Governor from appointing a
5 member of the Board of Regents of the University System of Maryland, the Board of
6 Directors of the Medical System Corporation or an officer, or a full-time employee of
7 the Medical System Corporation or the University of Maryland, Baltimore Campus
8 to the Emergency Medical Services Board; and generally relating to appointments to
9 the Emergency Medical Services Board.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
21 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Article – Education**

23 13–503.

24 (a) There is a Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

[Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law.



1 (b) The Institute is an independent agency located at the University of Maryland,
2 Baltimore Campus.

3 (c) The Institute shall be governed by the State Emergency Medical Services
4 Board.

5 (d) Funding for the Institute shall be from:

6 (1) The surcharge imposed under § 13–954 of the Transportation Article;

7 (2) General funds; and

8 (3) Funds from any other source.

10 (a) (1) The EMS Board consists of 11 members appointed by the Governor.

11 (2) Of the 11 members:

12 (i) One shall be the Secretary of Health or the Secretary's designee;

13 (ii) One shall be a representative of the University of Maryland,
14 Baltimore Campus, nominated by the Board of Regents;

15 (iii) One shall be the chairperson of the Advisory Council;

16 (iv) One shall be a physician knowledgeable in the delivery of
17 emergency medical services;

18 (v) One shall be a physician experienced in the clinical care of
19 trauma patients;

20 (vi) One shall be a nurse experienced in the clinical care of emergency
21 patients;

22 (vii) One shall be a career firefighter, emergency medical technician,
23 or rescue squad person knowledgeable in the delivery of emergency medical services;

24 (viii) One shall be a volunteer firefighter, emergency medical
25 technician, or rescue squad person knowledgeable in the delivery of emergency medical
26 services;

27 (ix) One shall be a hospital administrator knowledgeable in the
28 management and delivery of emergency medical services; and

29 (x) Two shall be from the public at large, one of whom shall reside

1 in a county with a population of less than 175,000.

2 (b) (1) Each appointed member shall have demonstrated interest or
3 experience in the delivery of emergency medical services.

4 (2) In appointing members to the EMS Board, the Governor shall take into
5 consideration the five emergency medical service regions of the State to assure a geographic
6 balance in the Board's membership.

7 (3) In appointing members to the EMS Board, the Governor shall take into
8 consideration persons:

9 (i) Recommended by the Advisory Council; or

10 (ii) Recommended by any statewide organization or association
11 which is interested and involved in the delivery of emergency medical services.

12 [(4) Except as authorized under this section, the Governor may not appoint
13 to the EMS Board any other person who is:

14 (i) A member of the Board of Regents;

15 (ii) A member of the Board of Directors of the Medical System
16 Corporation; or

17 (iii) An officer or full-time employee of the Medical System
18 Corporation or the University.]

19 (c) (1) The term of an appointed member is 4 years.

20 (2) At the end of a term, an appointed member continues to serve until a
21 successor is appointed and qualifies.

22 (3) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the
23 rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

24 (d) Annually, from among the members of the EMS Board:

25 (1) The Governor shall appoint a chairperson; and

26 (2) The chairperson shall appoint a vice chairperson.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
28 October 1, 2018.
