### 1 AN ACT concerning

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#### Election Law - Voting - Ballot Request and Canvassing Procedures

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering certain requirements for canvassing provisional ballots when 4 an individual <del>east</del> casts more than one ballot for the same election; requiring a local 5 board of elections to review all documents relating to an individual to verify certain 6 ballots if certain ballots are cast in the name of the same individual in the same 7 election; requiring a local board of elections to count a provisional verified ballot and 8 reject an absentee unverified ballot if both ballots are east in the name of the same 9 individual in the same election under certain circumstances the local board 10 determines that only one of the ballots was cast by the voter; requiring a local board of elections to reject both ballots if the local board determines that both ballots were 11 12 cast by the voter; requiring a voter who uses the online absentee ballot application 13 to request an absentee ballot be sent by any method or who uses any method to 14 request to receive a blank absentee ballot through the Internet to provide certain 15 information; providing for the effective dates of this Act; and generally relating to 16 ballot request and canvassing procedures.

5 6	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:			
7	Article – Election Law			
8	11–303.			
9 10 11	(a) Following an election, each local board shall meet at its designated counting center to canvass the provisional ballots cast in that election in accordance with the regulations and guidelines established by the State Board.			
12 13	(b) A local board may not open an envelope of a provisional ballot until the local board has approved the provisional ballot application.			
4	(c) The State Board shall adopt regulations to implement this section.			
15 16	(d) (1) A local board may not reject a provisional ballot except by unanimous vote and in accordance with regulations of the State Board.			
17	(2) The local board shall reject a provisional ballot if:			
18 19 20	(i) pursuant to paragraph (4) of this subsection, the local board determines that the individual who cast the provisional ballot is not qualified to vote that provisional ballot;			
21 22	(ii) the individual failed to sign the oath on the provisional ballot application; $\overline{\textbf{OR}}$			
23 24	(iii) the individual cast more than one PROVISIONAL ballot for the same election; or			
25 26 27	(iv) the local board determines that a provisional ballot is intentionally marked with an identifying mark that is clearly evident and placed on the ballot for the purpose of identifying the ballot.			
28 29	(3) If the intent of the voter with respect to a particular contest is not clearly demonstrated, the local board shall reject only the vote for that contest.			
30 31	(4) For the purposes of this section, an individual is qualified to vote the provisional ballot cast if the local board determines that:			

(i) the individual is registered in the State;

1 2 3	(ii) if the provisional ballot was cast because the voter failed to provide required identification, the individual who cast the provisional ballot has met the identification requirements established by the State Board; and
4 5 6	(iii) if the provisional ballot was cast during a period covered by a court order or other order extending the time for closing the polls, the order has not been invalidated by a subsequent court order.
7 8 9	(5) (I) IF A PROVISIONAL BALLOT AND AN ABSENTEE BALLOT OR TWO PROVISIONAL BALLOTS ARE CAST IN THE NAME OF THE SAME INDIVIDUAL FOR THE SAME ELECTION, THE LOCAL BOARD SHALL REVIEW ALL DOCUMENTS RELATING TO THE INDIVIDUAL TO VERIFY THE BALLOTS.
11 12 13	(II) IF THE LOCAL BOARD DETERMINES THAT ONLY ONE OF THE BALLOTS WAS CAST BY THE VOTER, THE LOCAL BOARD SHALL COUNT THE VERIFIED BALLOT AND REJECT THE UNVERIFIED BALLOT.
14 15	(III) IF THE LOCAL BOARD DETERMINES THAT BOTH OF THE BALLOTS WERE CAST BY THE VOTER, THE LOCAL BOARD SHALL REJECT BOTH BALLOTS.
17	(e) A local board shall count:
18 19	(1) the entire provisional ballot if the address on the provisional ballot application is within the precinct where the provisional ballot was cast; or
20 21 22	(2) only the votes cast by the voter for each candidate or question applicable to the precinct in which the voter resides, as determined by the address on the provisional ballot application of the voter.
23 24 25	(f) (1) The State Board shall ensure the establishment of a system that any individual who casts a provisional ballot may access without cost to discover whether the ballot was counted and, if not counted, the reason it was not.
26 27 28	(2) The system established under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall ensure the confidentiality of the individual who accesses the system and the secrecy of each ballot.

30 31	IF BOTH A PROVISIONAL BALLOT AND AN ABSENTEE BALLOT ARE CAST IN THE  NAME OF THE SAME INDIVIDUAL FOR THE SAME ELECTION, THE LOCAL BOARD SHALL:

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1 2 3	(1) COUNT THE PROVISIONAL BALLOT IF THE INDIVIDUAL IS QUALIFIED TO VOTE THE PROVISIONAL BALLOT UNDER § 11–303(D)(4) OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND
4	(2) REJECT THE ABSENTEE BALLOT.

18 19 20 21	(2) if the applicant is an absent uniformed services voter or overseas voter as defined in the federal Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act and does not have a Maryland driver's license or Maryland identification card, a Social Security number.]
