- 1 AN ACT concerning
- 2 Task Force to Study the Residential Environment of Seniors in Baltimore City
- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Task Force to Study the Residential Environment of 4 Seniors in Baltimore City; providing for the composition, chair, and staffing of the 5 Task Force; prohibiting a member of the Task Force from receiving certain 6 compensation but authorizing the reimbursement of certain expenses; requiring the 7 Task Force to study certain issues and make certain recommendations related to the 8 improvement of the residential environment of seniors living in Baltimore City; 9 requiring the Task Force to make a certain report to certain persons on or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the 10 11 Task Force to Study the Residential Environment of Seniors in Baltimore City.
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13 That:
- 14 (a) There is a Task Force to Study the Residential Environment of Seniors in Baltimore City.
- 16 (b) The Task Force consists of the following members:
- 17 (1) one member of the Senate of Maryland who represents Baltimore City, appointed by the President of the Senate;
- 19 (2) one member of the House of Delegates who represents Baltimore City, 20 appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- 21 (3) the Secretary of Aging, or the Secretary's designee;
- 22 (4) the Secretary of Housing and Community Development, or the 23 Secretary's designee;

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- (g) On or before December 1, 2018, the Task Force shall report its findings and recommendations to the Mayor of Baltimore City, the Baltimore City Council, and, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the Baltimore City House and Senate Delegations to the General Assembly.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2018. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2019, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
