1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Harford County – Alcoholic Beverages – Limit on Class DBR Licenses**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the maximum number of Class DBR licenses that may be
4 issued by the Harford County Board of License Commissioners to the same person;
5 and generally relating to Class DBR licenses in Harford County.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
17 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

19 22–102.

3 (a) There is a Class DBR license.

4 (b) (1) The license may be issued to a holder of a Class 5 brewery license.

5 (2) **THE BOARD MAY ISSUE A MAXIMUM NUMBER OF TWO LICENSES**
6 **TO THE SAME PERSON.**

7 (c) (1) The license serves as the on-premises consumption permit and the
8 license equivalent to a Class D license specified under § 2-207(f)(1) of this article.

9 (2) The license holder is not required to sell food, but is required to provide
10 prepackaged snacks.

11 (3) The license holder:

12 (i) may sell beer brewed at the brewery not exceeding 500 barrels
13 per year for on-premises consumption; but

14 (ii) may not sell any beer for off-premises consumption other than
15 what is allowed under the license holder's Class 5 brewery license.

16 (d) The value of the equipment used on the premises may be used toward meeting
17 any minimum capital investment requirement imposed on a holder of the license.

18 (e) The hours of sale are as provided for a Class D beer, wine, and liquor license
19 under Subtitle 20 of this title.

20 (f) The annual license fee is \$500.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
22 1, 2018.
