13 ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 EACH YEAR, THE TASK FORCE SHALL SUBMIT A 14 REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2–1246 OF THE STATE 15 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON THE ACTIVITIES OF THE 16 TASK FORCE.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial 18 members of the Advisory Board for the Task Force on the Social Determinants of Health in 19 Baltimore City specified in § 13–3606(b)(1) and (2) of the Health – General Article, as 20 enacted by Section 1 of this Act, shall expire as follows:

- 21 (1) two members in 2019;
- 22 (2) two members in 2020; and
- 23 (3) three members in 2021.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
 1, 2018. <u>It shall remain effective for a period of 7 years and, at the end of June 30, 2025, this</u>
 <u>Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no</u>
 <u>further force and effect.</u>
