A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety – Permit to Wear, Carry, or Transport a Handgun – Expiration**
3 **and Renewal**

4 FOR the purpose of altering the time period in which a permit to wear, carry, or transport
5 a handgun expires; altering the time period for renewal of a permit to wear, carry,
6 or transport a handgun; and generally relating to a permit to wear, carry, or
7 transport a handgun.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
14 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article – Public Safety**

16 5–309.

17 (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, a permit expires on the
18 last day of the holder’s birth month following [2] 5 years after the date the permit is issued.

19 (b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, a permit may be renewed for
20 successive periods of [3] 5 years each if, at the time of an application for renewal, the
21 applicant possesses the qualifications for the issuance of a permit and pays the renewal fee
22 stated in this subtitle.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

1 (c) A person who applies for a renewal of a permit is not required to be
2 fingerprinted unless the Secretary requires a set of the person's fingerprints to resolve a
3 question of the person's identity.

4 (d) The Secretary may establish an alternative expiration date for a permit to
5 coincide with the expiration of a license, certification, or commission for:

6 (1) a private detective under Title 13 of the Business Occupations and
7 Professions Article;

8 (2) a security guard under Title 19 of the Business Occupations and
9 Professions Article; or

10 (3) a special police officer under § 3-306 of this article.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 October 1, 2018.
