BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments, Article – Natural Resources Section 10-101(a) and (m)Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2017 Supplement) BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments. Article – Natural Resources Section 10–415(d) Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement Volume and 2017 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Natural Resources 10-101.

- 1 (a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 2 (m) "Nighttime" means the time beginning one—half hour after sunset and ending 3 one—half hour before sunrise the following day, as published in the Department's hunter's quide, unless this title provides otherwise.
- 5 10-415.
- 6 (d) (1) In this subsection, "Deer Management Permit" means a permit issued 7 by the Department authorizing the holder or an agent of the holder to hunt deer outside of 8 deer hunting season for the purpose of preventing damage to crops.
- 9 (2) In Charles County and St. Mary's County, an individual who hunts deer 10 under a Deer Management Permit may:
- 11 (i) Use a shotgun or breech loading center fired rifle approved by 12 the Department to hunt deer throughout the year, including all deer hunting seasons, in 13 the locations and under the conditions set forth in the permit; and
- 14 (ii) On State land in Charles County or St. Mary's County leased by 15 the permit holder for the purpose of cultivating crops, hunt deer on the leased land in the 16 locations and under the conditions set forth in the permit.
- 17 (3) To protect public safety and welfare, the Department may restrict the lands on which an individual may hunt deer under a Deer Management Permit.
- 19 (4) (i) This paragraph applies only in Frederick County.
- 20 (ii) Subject to the conditions set forth in a Deer Management Permit, 21 a permittee may use a rifle approved by the Department to harvest deer throughout the 22 year, including all deer hunting seasons.
- 23 (iii) In Frederick County Zone 1, as defined in COMAR 24 08.03.03.06A.(3)(g), an agent of a permittee may use a rifle to harvest deer throughout the 25 year.
- 26 (iv) 1. This subparagraph applies only in Frederick County Zone 2, as defined in COMAR 08.03.03.06A.(3)(h).
- 28 2. Except as provided in subsubparagraph 3 of this subparagraph, an agent of a permittee may use a rifle to harvest deer in a period beginning October 1 and ending March 31.
- 3. In a deer firearms season, an agent of a permittee may harvest deer only by using the weapon approved for that season.
