WHEREAS, Law enforcement relies on the community and media as partners in its



- 1 search for missing persons, especially in those cases that remain open; and
- WHEREAS, All missing persons should be reported to the police as soon as possible with information such as the person's last known location and physical description,
- 4 including a description of the clothing the person was wearing; and
- WHEREAS, It is important to keep current photos of loved ones available should they go missing in order to assist those searching for them; and
- WHEREAS, Families can take steps to prevent child abduction by knowing where their children play, knowing their friends, and talking with them about their safety at home, at school, and on the Internet; and
- WHEREAS, All missing persons deserve to be searched for, regardless of their age; and
- WHEREAS, Our awareness, support, efforts, and willingness to search for missing persons must continue because it is crucial that we keep missing children awareness a priority in our communities; and
- WHEREAS, Citizens, law enforcement agencies, family service agencies, and other organizations are encouraged to observe Missing Children Day through appropriate activities; now, therefore,
- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 19 That Section(s) 7–409 through 7–417, respectively, of Article – General Provisions of the 20 Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7–410 through 7–418,
- 21 respectively.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 24 Article General Provisions
- 25 **7–409**.
- THE GOVERNOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM MAY 25 AS MISSING CHILDREN DAY.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 29 October 1, 2018.
